AGFC Digital Code Approval

Date: April 25, 2019

Explanation: The Administrative, IT, Communications, and Legal Divisions have collaborated to codify all existing, Commission-approved regulations into digital form within a software platform accessible via https://apps.agfc.com/regulations (the "Digital Code") and propose making that the new, official repository of Commission regulations. Maintaining the Commission regulations within this Digital Code software platform will enable staff to more easily and accurately make regulation changes when approved by the Commission and will improve public usability, transparency, and accountability by offering features such as public comment on proposed regulations and amendments, revision history and comparison tools, clickable cross-references, search, and access on mobile and other devices.

It was not the intent of the digital codification to make any substantive changes to the existing, approved regulations. On the other hand, transferring the existing, approved regulations into the software platform for the Digital Code did necessitate making certain non-substantive, technical modifications to the formatting, internal numbering scheme, and organization of the regulations, and also led to removing typographical errors and generally improving the readability of the regulations.

Last month, the Regulations Committee gave approval for the proposed Digital Code to be made available for comment by the public. Afterwards, notice of the impending digital codification of Commission regulations and the availability of a preview draft at https://apps.agfc.com/regulations was communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and the general public throughout the state for review and comment. No negative comments were received during that time. Accordingly, the Digital Code is now ready for final consideration by the full Commission and a proposed Minute Order is included.

As of the 2019-2020 season:

Permits may be purchased for the following dates only: First ten (10) days of the first segment; Second (2nd) day after Christmas for ten (10) days; last ten (10) days of the third segment Each permit will allow the non-resident to hunt waterfowl on a specified WMA for up to five (5) consecutive days. The desired WMA and hunting dates must be selected from the options available at the time of purchase and all selections are final. Permit purchases are nonrefundable and nontransferable to other persons, dates, or WMAs.

This permit is in addition to hunting and/or guide license requirements as stated in <u>Chapter 03.00</u>. This permit must be in the person's possession while taking or attempting to take waterfowl on these WMAs.
