**WHEREAS,** the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission wishes to recognize and honor the important sacrifices made by our State's disabled military veterans in the service of our nation; **and**

**WHEREAS,** at the request of the Commission, on April 5, 2019, the Arkansas General Assembly enacted Act 729, which authorizes the Commission to create the addition of a Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License at a cost of \$52.50 for any resident disabled veteran who has: (1) a service-connected disability rating of seventy-percent (70%) or higher; or (2) a service-connected disability rating of fifty percent (50%) or higher and is a recipient of the Purple Heart medal; **and**

**WHEREAS,** the Director and AGFC staff have proposed the attached regulation amendments to: revise the "Disabled Veteran" definition; amend fishing license and hunting license requirements affecting Disabled Veterans; and create the addition of the new Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License, which will include a lifetime trout stamp and lifetime state duck stamp; **and**






**WHEREAS,** the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and its staff have proposed the attached regulations to amend existing requirements for captive wildlife, including to: (1) add approximately 104 species of birds and turtles to the Unrestricted Captive Wildlife Species List; (2) add approximately 486 species of mammals, birds, venomous snakes, turtles, and toads to the Permitted Captive Wildlife Species List; and (3) provide authorization to the Director to extend current Wildlife Breeder/Dealer Permits and Wildlife Importation Permits for up to 90 days from the permit expiration date of June 30, 2019, for those permittees authorized to import, breed or sell certain mammal species currently under review—specifically, zebra, water buffalo, addax, aoudad sheep, brindled gnu, gaur, oryx, capybara, leopard, jaguar, hippopotamus, warthogs, rhinoceros, gerenuk, Himalayan tahr goat, impala, kudu, lechwe, ibex and nilgai. The 90-day extension of the permit expiration date to September 29, 2019, will allow staff additional time to finalize species evaluations for these mammal species, submit proposed regulations concerning them to the Commission for approval, and then consider each permit holder's 2019-20 application for permit renewal; **and**

**WHEREAS,** the attached regulations have been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; **and**

**WHEREAS,** after carefully considering the recommendations of Commission staff and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulations promote sound wildlife conservation and management and are consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution and that these regulations should now be approved for application statewide.

Compare this rule with federal and state counterparts: Regulations vary greatly among states, the proposed regulations reduces regulations on 104 species by adding them to the unrestricted captive wildlife species list. The proposed regulations adds 486 (of which 435 are venomous snakes) to the permitted captive wildlife species list that upon staff review appear to pose a moderate but manageable risk to human health and safety, native fish and wildlife health or populations, or agriculture such that they warrant further restriction or oversight.






