The proposed regulations adds 486 (of which 435 are venomous snakes) to the permitted captive wildlife species list that upon staff review appear to pose a moderate but manageable risk to human health and safety, native fish and wildlife health or populations, or agriculture such that they warrant further restriction or oversight.
