

27.01 Trout Permit Requirements

It is unlawful for persons 16 or older to keep trout from waters of the state or to fish without a valid trout permit on the following waters:

- A. Beaver Lake Tailwater from Beaver Dam to the boundary signs at Houseman Access;
- B. Lake Greeson Tailwater from Narrows Dam to Muddy Fork Road (low-water bridge);
- C. Little Red River from Greers Ferry Dam to the Arkansas Highway 305 bridge;
- D. North Fork of the White River downstream of Norfork Dam;
- E. White River from Bull Shoals Dam to the Arkansas Highway 58 bridge at Guion; and
- F. Spring River from 100 yards below Dam 1 at Mammoth Spring State Park downstream to the mouth of Myatt Creek.

EXCEPTIONS:

- A. In compliance with Chapter [36.00](#).
- B. Persons possessing a Lifetime Resident Combination Sportsman's License and Permit or Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License and Permit.











WHEREAS, the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and its staff have proposed the attached amendments for the purpose of clarifying various existing hunting and fishing regulations, including correcting grammar, punctuation and making other minor changes to wording; **and**

WHEREAS, the attached regulations have been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; **and**

WHEREAS, after carefully considering the recommendations of the Director, Commission staff and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulations promote sound wildlife conservation and management and are consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution and that these regulations should now be approved for application statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED this 19th day of January 2023, that the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission hereby approves and adopts the attached regulations, which shall become effective immediately upon public filing or as soon thereafter as possible.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission staff is authorized to proceed with legally certifying and filing the attached regulations with the Secretary of State, State Library, and Bureau of Legislative Research and incorporating them into the Commission Code Book and Addendum.

At that time, regulations and business pertaining to the operation of the Game and Fish Commission and other fiscal and administrative matters will be considered and acted upon. Additionally, Committee meetings attended by Commissioners and agency staff members will be held throughout the day on Wednesday, January 18, 2023, beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Little Rock Office Complex, 2 Natural Resources Drive, Little Rock, AR 72205. All interested persons are invited to attend these meetings.

The Commission meeting on January 19th will be live-streamed and a link for easy viewing access will be available on the agency website. Please visit the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission website at <https://www.agfc.com> for additional up-to-date details as the January meeting dates draw closer.

Items on the agenda for the January 19, 2023 meeting will include consideration of various Hunting and Fishing Regulations and regulations pertaining to the Enforcement Division of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, including but not limited to:

- Clarify what to do with certain prohibited live carp when caught;
- Clarify list of waters where a trout permit is required to keep trout;
- Remove Lake Sylvia as an exception to the statewide daily limit for largemouth bass;
- Remove Horseshoe Lake (Crittenden County) as an exception to the statewide daily limit for crappie;
- Remove Lake Austell (Cross County) and Lake Greenlee from the length limit restrictions on keeping largemouth bass;
- Remove Lake Charles from the length limit restrictions on keeping crappie;
- Clarify the deer season bag limits for Zone 9;
- Clarify the effective dates of waterfowl hunting restrictions on specific WMAs and lakes; and
- Correct a technical error in the spelling of Dyer Lake regarding waterfowl hunting restrictions on specific WMAs and lakes.

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the January 19, 2023 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before January 9, 2023. Copies of any proposed rules or regulations may be obtained at the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission main office and at www.agfc.com, or through a written request mailed to the address below.
