April 2023 Proposal Summary:

1. **Proposal:** Establish a new Natural area called Sugar Loaf Mountains-Midland Peak Natural Area for hunting.
Justification: Arkansas Natural Heritage requested that the area be opened to hunting opportunities as the other Natural areas are. This is 1191 acres in Sebastian County. WMA zone 609
Code: 19.04, 20.02, 20.24, C1.01, C1.02, C1.04, C1.09, C1.13, C1.16
2. **Proposal:** Establish a new Natural area called Goats Beard Bluff Natural Area for hunting.
Justification: Arkansas Natural Heritage requested that the area be opened to hunting opportunities as the other Natural areas are. This is 540 acres in Saline County. WMA zone 267
Code: 19.04, 20.02, 20.24, C1.01, C1.02, C1.04, C1.09, C1.13, C1.16
3. **Proposal:** To add a dog tag permit fee for non-resident deer dog hunters.
Justification: This is will be a \$20 permit that is needed to establish data to determine how many individuals with dogs are coming into the state for hunting deer with dogs and impacting the wildlife resources. This yearly permit will only be sold through June 2026 then end.
Code: 8.08, D1.01
4. **Proposal:** Allow the riding of horse on Choctaw WMA for raccoon hunters.
Justification: This will allow hunters to use horses on the WMA for raccoon hunting between sunset and sunrise without interfering with open deer season.
Code: 20.20
5. **Proposal:** Make an exception for the Cache River at Black Swamp.
Justification: This will enable boating transit to remain unimpeded for the general public on this waterway.
Code: C1.12
6. **Proposal:** Establish a new WMA of the Hot Springs State Forest WMA.
Justification: AR Dept. of Agriculture Division of Forestry has purchased 2974 acres within the Hot Springs recharge area of the Hot Springs National Park, Mr. Joe Fox of Division of Forestry, State Forester approached the AGFC in regards to establishing a new WMA for regulating hunting on the property. WMA Zone 365
Code: 19.04, 20.02, 20.24, C1.01, C1.02, C1.04, C1.09, C1.13, C1.16
7. **Proposal:** Increase license fees for non-resident hunting. Also increase the guide license fees for non-resident hunting and fishing.
Justification: These prices have not increased in years and the Commission needs to raise additional income for management of the State's wildlife resources. Create a Non-resident WMA Waterfowl 5 day permit, Alligator, Bear, turkey and elk permit in addition to license required.
Code: D1.01, 3.04

C1.09 – Furbearer Season And Limits On WMAs

- A. **Gray Fox, Mink and Red Fox Hunting:** Sunrise on the first day of September to sunset on the last day of February (day hunting only).
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit 2 per species, possession unlimited.
- B. **Opossum and Striped Skunk Hunting:** Sunrise on the first day of September to sunset on the last day of February (day or night hunting; dogs are required for hunting at night).
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.
- C. **Bobcat Hunting:** Sunrise on the first day of September to sunset on the last day of February (dogs required to hunt bobcat at night) and during turkey season (day hunting only; no dogs allowed).
 - **EXCEPTIONS:**
 1. Closed during turkey and squirrel seasons on WMAs where a turkey or squirrel season is closed.
 2. During youth turkey hunts, only youths may take bobcat.
 3. Hope Upland and Rick Evans Grandview Prairie WMAs are closed to bobcat hunting except on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays during daylight hours only.
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit 2, possession unlimited.
- D. **Coyote Hunting:** Sunrise on the first day of July through sunset on the last day of February (dogs not allowed to hunt coyote) and during turkey season (day hunting only; no dogs allowed).
 - **EXCEPTIONS:**
 1. Closed during turkey and squirrel seasons on WMAs where a turkey or squirrel season is closed.
 2. During youth turkey hunts, only youths may take coyote.
 3. Hope Upland and Rick Evans Grandview Prairie WMA are closed to coyote hunting except on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays during daylight hours only.
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.
- E. **River Otter Hunting:** Sunrise on the second Saturday in November through sunset on the last day of February (day hunting only).
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit 2, possession unlimited.
- F. **Raccoon Hunting:** Sunset first day of July through the last day of August (night hunting only; dogs are required); first day of September through the last day of February (day or night hunting; dogs are required for hunting at night); first day of March through the last day of March (night hunting only; dogs are required).
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.
- G. **Muskrat, Nutria, and Beaver Hunting:** Sunrise on the first day of September through sunset on the last day of February.
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.
- H. **Badger, Spotted Skunk (Civet Cat), and Weasel Hunting:** Closed.
- I. **Furbearer Trapping (Other than Beaver, Coyote, and Nutria):** Sunrise on the second Saturday in November through sunset on the last day of February.
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.
- J. **Beaver and Nutria Trapping:** Sunrise on the second Saturday in November through the last day of March.
 - **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.
- K. **Coyote Trapping:** Sunrise on the first day of August through sunset on the last day of March.

- **LIMIT:** Daily limit unlimited, possession unlimited.

EXCEPTIONS:

- A. Only enclosed, pull-activated dog-proof traps may be utilized on Camp Robinson SUA.
- B. Cedar Creek and Electric Island WMAs are closed to all furbearer hunting and trapping.
- C. J. Perry Mikles Blue Mountain SUA is closed to all trapping. Chase for pleasure or training purposes is permitted year-round. Closed during field trials.
- D. Furbearer hunting and trapping allowed under the conditions, seasons, and limits provided by the required annual refuge hunting permit or refuge trapping permit on all NWRs.
- E. Buffalo National River, Camp Robinson WMA, and Ditch 28 on Big Lake WMA are closed to all trapping.
- F. Bobcat, coyote, and fox hunting with dogs allowed on Casey Jones WMA in accordance with Code [22.01](#).
- G. Trapping is closed on that portion of the Hot Springs State Forest WMA lying within the city limits of Hot Springs. Furbearer hunting only in compliance with Code 20.02-M.

LEGAL NOTICE

The regular monthly meeting of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission will be held beginning at 9:00 a.m. Thursday, May 18, 2023, at the Vada Sheid Community Development Center on the Arkansas State University-Mountain Home campus, 1600 South College Street, Mountain Home, AR 72653. At that time, regulations and business pertaining to the operation of the Game and Fish Commission and other fiscal and administrative matters will be considered and acted upon. Additionally, Committee meetings attended by Commissioners and agency staff members will be held throughout the day on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, beginning at 8:00 a.m. at the Vada Sheid Community Development Center on the Arkansas State University-Mountain Home campus. All interested persons are invited to attend these meetings.

The Commission meeting on May 18th will be live-streamed and a link for easy viewing access will be available on the agency website. Please visit the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission website at <https://www.agfc.com> for additional up-to-date details as the May meeting dates draw closer.

Items on the agenda for the May 18, 2023 meeting will include discussion and/or adoption of proposed regulations that previously were considered at the April 19-20, 2023 Commission Meetings, plus consideration of various Hunting and Fishing Regulations and regulations pertaining to the Enforcement Division of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, including but not limited to:

- **Fishing Regulations** – Amend existing regulations for Non-Resident Fishing License Requirements, including remove option for Non-Resident 14-Day Trip Fishing License and increase amount of Non-Resident Guide License/Fishing.
- **Hunting Regulations** –
 - Amend existing regulations for Non-Resident Hunting License Requirements, including annual license fee amounts and requirements for hunting various game animals, including small game, waterfowl, alligator, deer, turkey, bear, and elk. More specifically, increase amounts of Non-Resident Deer Hunting Licenses, Non-Resident Guide License/Hunting, Non-Resident WMA Waterfowl Hunting Permit (5-day trip), and Arkansas Non-Resident Waterfowl Stamp, and establish Non-Resident Permits for hunting bear, turkey, elk, and alligator.
 - Adopt regulation to require a Non-Resident Hunting Dog Permit before a nonresident may use any dog to hunt, chase, pursue or retrieve deer, or to train a dog for such purposes.
 - Amend existing regulations for Wildlife Management Areas, including establish Hot Springs State Forest WMA, Goat's Beard Bluff Natural Area WMA, and Sugarloaf Mountains-Midland Peak Natural Area WMA plus establish user requirements for these WMAs, including restrictions for camping, firearms, and hunting deer, turkey, furbearers, feral hogs, and other game.
 - Amend existing regulation to clarify that prohibition for horses and mules on Freddie Black Choctaw Island WMA Deer Research Area applies from sunrise to sunset during an open deer season.

- Amend existing regulation for boating and duck hunting on certain WMAs and lakes to clarify that on Rex Hancock Black Swamp WMA the Common Restriction A applies except within the Cache River.
- **Policy/Procedures** – Adopt policy and procedures to establish (1) Civil Rights Complaint and Appeal Procedure; and (2) Limited English Proficiency Plan and Policy.

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the May 18, 2023 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before May 8, 2023.
