Summary

Purpose:

To amend miscellaneous regulations for the purpose of replacing all references to "Wildlife Officer" or "Enforcement Officer" in the AGFC Code Book with the term "Game Warden". On April 13, 2023, Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders signed Act 852 (a/k/a HB1813) approving legislative intent to change all similar references to AGFC Wildlife or Enforcement Officers in existing statutes to "Game Wardens."

Act 852 will become effective approximately July 31, 2023, and it is AGFC staff's recommendation to implement the complementary changes in the AGFC Code Book during this same timeframe to facilitate accuracy and consistency, and promote public understanding.

Affected Codes:

The codes to be amended include 01.00-B, 03.10, 05.04, 05.29, 05.31, 09.10, 09.11, 33.01, 35.02, 36.02, 37.03, and O1.01.

Wildlife Officers Game Wardens shall be commissioned by the Commission and shall have the right to apprehend persons detected of violating any of the laws or regulations of the State enacted for the protection of game, fish, furbearing animals and other wildlife, and to take such offenders before any court having jurisdiction in the county where such offense is committed. Wildlife Officers Game Wardens shall be authorized to serve all processes issued by a court of competent jurisdiction relating to the enforcement of all laws and regulations pertaining to game, fish, furbearing animals, and other wildlife of the State; to go upon any property outside of private dwellings, posted or otherwise, in the performance of their duties; to carry firearms while performing duties; and to conduct searches with or without a warrant according to law. Additionally, Wildlife Officers Game Wardens lawfully present in any place may, in the performance of their duties, stop and detain any person who they reasonably suspect is, or recently has been, involved in any hunting, fishing, or trapping activity to conduct an administrative inspection to determine whether the person is in compliance with the laws and regulations of the State enacted for the protection of game, fish, furbearing animals, and other wildlife. Wildlife Officers Game Wardens may request that the person stopped and detained immediately surrender the following items for inspection: all killing devices, licenses, permits, tags, stamps, check sheets, ice chests, game bags, game vests, wildlife, fishing tackle, equipment used for hunting or fishing, or containers that can reasonably hold wildlife (Code 05.30).

Sheriffs, constables and other law enforcement officers certified by the State of Arkansas, and special agents and employees of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, National Park Service and U.S. Forest Service who have been authorized to enforce laws and regulations administered by the U.S. Department of the Interior or U.S. Department of Agriculture shall, upon request by the Commission and upon proper oath or affirmation, have authority to make arrests, searches and seizures for violations of State game and fish laws and regulations. They shall serve without compensation from the Commission in the discharge of those duties. Wildlife Officers_Game Wardens may be appointed as special agents by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and shall have the additional authority conferred upon them by that agency. They shall serve without extra compensation in the discharge of those duties.

Amending the codebook to reflect changes from Act 852 which concludes that AGFC officers should henceforth be referred to as "Game Wardens."

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the June 15, 2023 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before June 10, 2023.
