Revised 7/2015 to reflect new legislation passed in the 2015 Regular Session (Act 1258). This act changed the effective date from 30 days to 10 days after filing the rule.

03.03 -- Resident Hunting License Requirements

It is unlawful for a resident to hunt wildlife by any means in Arkansas without possessing on the person the appropriate Arkansas hunting license as provided herein:

- A. To hunt alligator, deer, turkey, bear or elk, the hunter must have physical possession of a valid Arkansas hunting license. Additionally, to hunt bear, the hunter must have physical possession of a valid Resident Bear Tag.
- B. Arkansas Residents (16 years of age and older) – **Small Game:** Resident Wildlife Conservation License; Resident Sportsman's License; **Big Game:** Resident Wildlife Conservation License (permits residents to harvest one legal deer during any deer season); Resident Sportsman's License; **Furbearer (Hunting):** Any valid hunting license. **Furbearer (Trapping):** Any valid hunting license and a resident trappers permit. **All game:** Holders of the following licenses are entitled to hunt all game, except if taking waterfowl an Arkansas Resident Waterfowl Stamp, Federal Waterfowl Stamp, and Harvest Information Program (HIP) are required: Resident 65 Plus Lifetime Sportsman's Hunting License (or 65 Plus Lifetime Combination License); Resident 65 Plus Annual Hunting License (or Resident 65 Plus Annual Combination License); Resident Disabled Lifetime Sportsman's Hunting License (or Resident Disabled Lifetime Combination License) Resident Disabled Hunting 3-Year License (or Resident Disabled Combination 3-Year License); Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Hunting License; or Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License. **All game:** Holders of the following license are entitled to hunt all game, including waterfowl with a Federal Waterfowl Stamp and Harvest Information Program (HIP): Resident Sportsman's Lifetime Combination License and Permit; Resident Natural State Lifetime Combination License and Permit; or Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License and Permit.

EXCEPTIONS:

- A. Residents hunting on a licensed game bird shooting resort in compliance with regulations (Code [09.06](#)).
- B. In compliance with Code [04.04](#) and Addendum [B1.14](#).

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and its staff have proposed the attached new and amended regulations for multiple purposes, including: establishing a new Resident Natural State Lifetime Combination License and Permit available for residents who are age 10 or younger; deleting a requirement that a hunter must physically tag a turkey immediately after harvesting and prior to moving the turkey; requiring that, prior to hunting bear, a hunter must obtain and have in physical possession a free Resident Bear Tag; requiring for participation in various special deer-hunting programs that a hunter must obtain and have in physical possession a free Deer Management Assistance Program Management Tag, Private Land CWD Management Tag, CWD Replacement Tag, and/or Urban Deer Hunt Management Tag; and clarifying that possession of certain valid Resident Lifetime Licenses and Permits are exceptions to the State Migratory Waterfowl Hunting Stamp requirements or the Trout Permit requirements, etc.; **and**

WHEREAS, the attached regulations have been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; **and**

WHEREAS, after carefully considering the recommendations of Commission staff and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulations promote sound wildlife conservation and management and are consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution and that these regulations should now be approved for application statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED this 21st day of September 2023, that the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission hereby approves and adopts the attached regulations, which shall become effective immediately upon public filing or as soon thereafter as possible.



BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission staff is authorized to proceed with legally certifying and filing the attached regulations with the Secretary of State, State Library, and Bureau of Legislative Research and incorporating them into the Commission Code Book and Addendum.

The regular monthly meeting of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission will be held beginning at 9:00 a.m. Thursday, September 21, 2023, at Riverwind Lodge at the Buffalo Outdoor Center located at 4699 AR-43, Ponca, AR 72670. At that time, regulations and business pertaining to the operation of the Game and Fish Commission and other fiscal and administrative matters will be considered and acted upon. Additionally, Committee meetings attended by Commissioners and agency staff members will be held throughout the day on Wednesday, September 20, 2023, beginning at 8:00 a.m. at Riverwind Lodge at the Buffalo Outdoor Center located at 4699 AR-43, Ponca, AR 72670. All interested persons are invited to attend these meetings (live-streaming will not be available). Visit the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission website at <https://www.agfc.com> for additional up-to-date details as the September meeting dates draw closer.

Items on the agenda for the September 21, 2023 meeting will include discussion and/or adoption of proposed regulations that previously were considered at the August 16-17, 2023 Commission Meetings, plus consideration of various Hunting and Fishing Regulations and regulations pertaining to the Enforcement Division of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, including but not limited to:

- **Miscellaneous Hunting and Fishing Regulations** – Amend existing regulations to:
 - Establish a new Resident Natural State Lifetime Combination License and Permit available for residents who are age 10 or younger; and also provide that limited availability is not to exceed 500 per fiscal year (July 1 through June 30), subject to the Director's discretion, sold on a first-come, first-served basis and only to be issued to an Arkansas resident who either (a) has not attained his or her 11th birthday on the date of purchase or (b) had not attained his or her 11th birthday on August 1, 2023, and the date of purchase is no later than December 31, 2023. All purchases are subject to availability and while quantities last.
 - Delete the requirement that a hunter must physically tag a turkey immediately after harvesting and prior to moving the turkey;
 - Require that, prior to hunting bear, a hunter must obtain and have in physical possession a free Resident Bear Tag; and
 - Require for participation in various special deer-hunting programs that a hunter must obtain and have in physical possession a free Deer Management Assistance Program (DMAP) Management Tag, Private Land CWD Management Tag, CWD Replacement Tag, and/or Urban Deer Hunt Management Tag, and clarify that a hunter must physically tag a deer with the particular special program tag immediately after harvesting and prior to moving the deer.
 - Clarify that possession of certain valid Resident Lifetime Licenses and Permits are exceptions to the State Migratory Waterfowl Hunting Stamp requirements.
 - Clarify that possession of certain valid Resident Lifetime Licenses and Permits are exceptions to the Trout Permit requirements.

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the September 21, 2023 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before September 11, 2023. Copies of any proposed rules or regulations may be
