## **2025 Waterfowl Regulation Proposals**

**Proposal**: 2025-26 Special Early Teal Season Dates

**Justification:** Blue-winged teal populations dropped to 4.599 million in the 2024 Waterfowl Breeding Population Survey. When the population falls below 4.7 million, federal frameworks call for a reduction in the number of early teal season days from the current 16-day season to a 9-day season. To maximize opportunity, staff propose early teal season to occur the third Saturday in September for 9 days.

Code affected: B1.02

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Proposal: 2025-26 Pintail Daily Bag Limit

Justification: There were no changes in the federal framework regarding regular waterfowl season dates and limits (except northern pintail). The federal frameworks allow an increase in the daily bag limit for northern pintails following a new interim harvest strategy adopted by all four Flyways and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. This harvest strategy will be implemented until there has been three seasons with a three bird bag and allow two years to analyze data and conduct a full evaluation of the strategy.

### **B1.08 Duck, Coot, And Merganser Season And Limits**

- **1st segment:** the Saturday before Thanksgiving through the first Monday after Thanksgiving
- 2nd segment: December 10 through December 23
- 3rd segment: December 27 through January 31

**EXCEPTION:** Ducks, coots, and mergansers may be taken during the Special Youth Waterfowl Hunt (Code 11.04) and Special Veteran and Active Duty Military Waterfowl Hunt (Addendum B1.15).

#### LIMITS:

Coot: Daily limit 15, possession limit 45.

**Ducks:** Daily limit 6. No more than four mallards (no more than 2 of which may be females), 43 pintails, 1 mottled duck, 1 scaup, 3 wood ducks, 2 redheads, 2 black ducks, and 2 canvasbacks. Possession limit no more than 3 daily limits.

**Mergansers:** Daily limit 5 (no more than 2 of which may be hooded mergansers). Possession limit no more than 3 daily limits.

- Changing the Special Early Teal Season dates from the current 16-day season to a 9-day season in accordance with the federal framework. The proposed season date change is "the third Saturday of September for 9 days" (Addendum B1.02).
- Increasing the daily limit on Pintails from 1 to 3 (Addendum B1.08).
