

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and its staff have proposed changing the season dates for the Veteran and Active Duty Military Waterfowl Hunt to the "Saturday and Sunday following the first Monday in February statewide" in Addendum B1.15 of the Commission Code Book and Addendum to align with the Special Youth Waterfowl Hunting Season; **and**

WHEREAS, Federal waterfowl season frameworks allow for two veteran/active duty military waterfowl hunt days and aligning these days with the youth season will offer more opportunity for veteran and active duty military; **and**

WHEREAS, the attached revised regulation (Addendum B1.15) has been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and women and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; **and**

WHEREAS, after carefully considering the recommendations of the Director, Commission staff, and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulation promotes sound fish and wildlife conservation and management, is consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution, and should now be approved for application statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED this 22nd day of May 2025, that the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission hereby approves and adopts the attached Veteran and Active Duty Military Waterfowl Hunt regulation (Addendum B1.15), which shall become effective immediately upon public filing or as soon thereafter as possible.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission staff is authorized to proceed with legally certifying and filing the attached regulation with the Secretary of State, State Library, and Bureau of Legislative Research, and incorporating it into the Commission Code Book and Addendum.


