### 20.27 -- Boating Restrictions On Certain WMAs and NWRs

- A. It is unlawful to operate motorboats or vessels or manipulate any similar device on any Commission-owned or -controlled WMA or on any NWR as follows:
  - 1. Weaving through congested vessel traffic;
  - 2. Jumping the wake of another vessel too close to such other vessel;
  - 3. Operating a vessel when visibility is obstructed;
  - 4. Moving at a speed that exceeds the safe and reasonable limits under the circumstances or that creates a hazardous wash or wake upon approaching or passing vessels;
  - 5. Inattentive operation;
  - 6. Failure to keep a proper lookout;
  - 7. Failure to observe navigation rules;
  - 8. Colliding with, striking, or bumping another vessel, object, or person;
  - 9. Operating while intoxicated or under the influence of any narcotic drug, barbiturate, or marijuana or while under any physical or mental disability so as to be incapable of operating safely under the circumstances;
  - 10. Swerving at the last possible moment to avoid collision where correction reasonably could have been made earlier;
  - 11. Otherwise operating a vessel in a manner that endangers life, limb, or property;
  - 12. Impeding the normal and reasonable movement of boating traffic, except when reduced speed is necessary for safe operation or in compliance with the law of regulations;
  - 13. With the exception of meeting oncoming boats, all boating traffic must proceed in single-file with no passing allowed, except limited passing may occur (i) when boats have exited the current direction of travel or are no longer under power, or (ii) when an overtaking boat is capable of passing without coming closer than 100 feet to another boat and at a rate of speed that will not create a hazardous wash or wake; or
  - 14. All boating traffic on the WMA or NWR must maintain a minimum distance of 100 feet (approximately 6-boat lengths) between boats proceeding in the same direction of travel.
- B. It is unlawful to negligently engage in any of the prohibited acts listed in subsection (A) above on any Commission-owned or -controlled WMA or on any NWR.
- C. It is unlawful to recklessly or intentionally engage in any of the prohibited acts listed in subsection (A) above on any Commission-owned or -controlled WMA or on any NWR.

#### **PENALTIES:**

- A. For negligent operation: Class 2
- B. For reckless or intentional operation: Class 4
  In addition, any person convicted of a violation of this regulation will be prohibited from entering upon all WMAs or NWRs for a period of 1 year from the date of conviction.

which suspension will prohibit the person from entering Commission-owned WMAs and lakes during the term of the suspension; and

WHEREAS,

the amendments to Code 01.00-R provide that persons convicted of violating Code 05.37 will be ineligible for a reduction of their suspension term but that suspensions imposed more than 15 years ago will not be considered for the purpose of determining eligibility for a reduction provided in Code 01.00-R; and

WHEREAS,

the attached revised regulations (Codes 01.00-R, 03.14, 05.37, and 20.27; and Addenda A1.02, C1.04, D1.01, E1.02, and N1.02) have been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and women and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; and

WHEREAS,

after carefully considering the recommendations of the Director, Commission staff, and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulations promote sound fish and wildlife conservation and management, are consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution, and should now be approved for application statewide.

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordered this 19<sup>th</sup> day of June 2025, that the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission hereby approves and adopts the attached regulation amendments to Codes 01.00-R (Administrative Hearing Procedures), 03.14 (Resident Guide License Requirements), 05.37 (Obstruction of Hunting, Fish or Trapping Prohibited), and 20.27 (Boating Restrictions on Certain WMAs and NWRs) of the Commission Code Book and its Addenda A1.02 (Wild Turkey Season and Limits), C1.04 (Wild Turkey Seasons and Limits on WMAs), D1.01 (Licenses, Permits, Stamps, Tags, Costs, and Expiration Dates), E1.02 (Turkey Zone Descriptions), and N1.02 (Length and Protected Length Limits on Certain Lakes and Rivers), which shall become effective immediately upon public filing or as soon thereafter as possible.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED** that the Commission staff is authorized to proceed with legally certifying and filing the attached regulations with the Secretary of State, State Library, and Bureau of Legislative Research, and incorporating them into the Commission Code Book and Addendum.

At that time, regulations and business pertaining to the operation of the Game and Fish Commission and other fiscal and administrative matters will be considered and acted upon. Additionally, Committee meetings attended by Commissioners and agency staff members will be held throughout the day on Wednesday, June 18, 2025, beginning at 12:00 p.m. at the Golden Glo Studio located at 1238 Country Club Road, Camden, AR 71701. All interested persons are invited to attend these meetings.

The Commission meeting on June 19<sup>th</sup> will be live-streamed and a link for easy viewing access will be available on the agency website. Please visit the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission website at <a href="https://www.agfc.com">https://www.agfc.com</a> for additional up-to-date details as the meeting dates draw closer.

Items on the agenda for the June 19, 2025 meeting will include discussion and/or adoption of proposed regulations that previously were considered at the May 14-15, 2025 Commission Meetings, plus consideration of various Hunting and Fishing Regulations and regulations pertaining to the Enforcement Division of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, including but not limited to:

- Provide that persons convicted of violating Code 05.37 (regarding disorderly conduct while hunting, fishing or trapping) shall not be eligible to have their license suspension term reduced by the Administrative Hearing Officer (Code 01.00-R).
- Permit the Administrative Hearing Officer to modify a person's license suspension to allow hunting if there were no hunting-related offenses, or fishing if there were no fishing-related offenses, provided that the person's hunting and fishing licenses, rights, and privileges have not been suspended or revoked within the previous 15 years (Code 01.00-R).
- Create a resident combination hunting/fishing guide license for \$350 (Code 03.14 & Addendum D1.01).
- Prohibit and penalize harassment and public disorder of hunting, fishing or trapping activities (Code 05.37).
- Modify boating restrictions on certain WMAs and NWRs by increasing the penalties for negligent operation from Class 2 to Class 3 & for reckless or intentional operation from Class 3 to Class 4 (Code 20.27).
- Modify wild turkey season dates (Addendum A1.02).
- Modify wild turkey season dates and limits on WMAs (Addendum C1.04).
- Modify Turkey Zone Descriptions (Addendum E1.02).
- Create an exemption from the 16-inch length restriction for largemouth bass on Lakes Barnett, Brewer, and Poinsett during agency-approved fishing tournaments (Addendum N1.02).
- Discussion of access restrictions during duck season on WMAs.

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the June 19, 2025 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any

request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before June 9, 2025.
