

A1.02 -- Wild Turkey Season And Limits

No more than 1 legal turkey may be taken per day, no more than 1 legal turkey may be taken during the first 7 days of the season, no more than 1 legal turkey may be taken during the youth turkey hunt, and no more than 2 legal turkeys may be taken in any combination of turkey zones. Nonresident (adults and youth) may take no more than 1 legal turkey. No jakes (sub-adult male turkeys) may be taken, except youth, including nonresident youth, hunters may harvest 1 jake.

WILD TURKEY FIREARMS AND ARCHERY/CROSSBOW SEASONS:

Zone 3: Monday closest to April 3 for 21 days.
Zone 2: Monday closest to April 10 for 21 days.
Zone 2A: Monday closest to April 10 for 9 days.
Zone 1: Monday closest to April 17 for 21 days.
Zone 1A: Monday closest to April 17 for 9 days.

EXCEPTIONS:

- A. In compliance with WMA Addendum [C1.04](#).
- B. In compliance with Code [11.03](#).

SPECIAL YOUTH TURKEY SEASON:

Zones 1, 1A, 2, and 2A: Saturday and Sunday prior to the Monday closest to April 10.

LIMIT:

Zone 1A and 2A: 1 adult gobbler.

Zone 1, 2, and 3: 2 adult gobblers.

Special Youth Turkey Season: 1 legal turkey. Youth hunters, including nonresident youth, may only take 1 jake.

Firearms and Archery/Crossbow: Statewide seasonal limit of 2 legal gobblers with nonresident youth restricted to a seasonal limit of 1 legal gobbler.

Youth hunters, including nonresident youth, may take only 1 jake and no more than the statewide season limit in combination during the youth hunt and wild turkey firearms and archery/crossbow seasons (Addenda [A1.02](#), [C1.04](#)).

- WHEREAS,** the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and its staff have proposed the attached regulation amendments to Codes 01.00-R (Administrative Hearing Procedures), 03.14 (Resident Guide License Requirements), 05.37 (Obstruction of Hunting, Fish or Trapping Prohibited), and 20.27 (Boating Restrictions on Certain WMAs and NWRs) of the Commission Code Book and its Addenda A1.02 (Wild Turkey Season and Limits), C1.04 (Wild Turkey Seasons and Limits on WMAs), D1.01 (Licenses, Permits, Stamps, Tags, Costs, and Expiration Dates), E1.02 (Turkey Zone Descriptions), and N1.02 (Length and Protected Length Limits on Certain Lakes and Rivers); **and**
- WHEREAS,** these amendments are needed to (1) address the harassment and public disorder of hunters and others in relation to hunting, fishing, trapping, or boating activities; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Code 03.14 and Addendum D1.01 create a new Resident Combination Guide License (GLC) that costs \$350, expires June 30 each year, and allows Arkansas residents to guide, aid, or assist another person, for pay or other consideration, for hunting and fishing in Arkansas; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Addendum N1.02 authorize the Fisheries Division to, upon request by a fishing tournament official, issue a permit exempting tournament anglers from the 16-inch length restriction on largemouth bass on Lakes Barnett, Brewer, and Poinsett; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Addenda A1.02, C1.04, and E1.02 address the restructuring of wild turkey hunting season dates, harvest limits, and zones, which includes dividing the state into 5 new turkey zones that follow county lines and specifying that each wildlife management area constitutes its own zone, with individual season dates and harvest limits for each zone; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Code 05.37 add a list of specifically prohibited actions (including the obstruction of lawful hunting, fishing, or trapping) and increase the penalty from Class 2 to Class 3 or 4 depending on the nature of the violation; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Code 20.27 increase the penalty from Class 3 to Class 4 for recklessly or intentionally operating a motorboat or vessel in a prohibited manner on certain WMAs and NWRs; **and**
- WHEREAS,** a conviction of a Class 3 or 4 violation will result in the suspension of a person's hunting and fishing licenses, rights, and privileges for at least 1 year (for Class 3) or 2 years (for Class 4), and possibly longer if the person also has other points,

which suspension will prohibit the person from entering Commission-owned WMAs and lakes during the term of the suspension; **and**

WHEREAS, the amendments to Code 01.00-R provide that persons convicted of violating Code 05.37 will be ineligible for a reduction of their suspension term but that suspensions imposed more than 15 years ago will not be considered for the purpose of determining eligibility for a reduction provided in Code 01.00-R; **and**

WHEREAS, the attached revised regulations (Codes 01.00-R, 03.14, 05.37, and 20.27; and Addenda A1.02, C1.04, D1.01, E1.02, and N1.02) have been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and women and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; **and**


WHEREAS, after carefully considering the recommendations of the Director, Commission staff, and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulations promote sound fish and wildlife conservation and management, are consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution, and should now be approved for application statewide.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED this 19th day of June 2025, that the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission hereby approves and adopts the attached regulation amendments to Codes 01.00-R (Administrative Hearing Procedures), 03.14 (Resident Guide License Requirements), 05.37 (Obstruction of Hunting, Fish or Trapping Prohibited), and 20.27 (Boating Restrictions on Certain WMAs and NWRs) of the Commission Code Book and its Addenda A1.02 (Wild Turkey Season and Limits), C1.04 (Wild Turkey Seasons and Limits on WMAs), D1.01 (Licenses, Permits, Stamps, Tags, Costs, and Expiration Dates), E1.02 (Turkey Zone Descriptions), and N1.02 (Length and Protected Length Limits on Certain Lakes and Rivers), which shall become effective immediately upon public filing or as soon thereafter as possible.





The regular monthly meeting of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission will be held beginning at 8:00 a.m. Thursday, June 19, 2025, at the Golden Glo Studio located at 1238 Country Club Road, Camden, AR 71701. At that time, regulations and business pertaining to the operation of the Game and Fish Commission and other fiscal and administrative matters will be considered and acted upon. Additionally, Committee meetings attended by Commissioners and agency staff members will be held throughout the day on Wednesday, June 18, 2025, beginning at 12:00 p.m. at the Golden Glo Studio located at 1238 Country Club Road, Camden, AR 71701. All interested persons are invited to attend these meetings.

The Commission meeting on June 19th will be live-streamed and a link for easy viewing access will be available on the agency website. Please visit the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission website at <https://www.agfc.com> for additional up-to-date details as the meeting dates draw closer.

Items on the agenda for the June 19, 2025 meeting will include discussion and/or adoption of proposed regulations that previously were considered at the May 14-15, 2025 Commission Meetings, plus consideration of various Hunting and Fishing Regulations and regulations pertaining to the Enforcement Division of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, including but not limited to:

- Provide that persons convicted of violating Code 05.37 (regarding disorderly conduct while hunting, fishing or trapping) shall not be eligible to have their license suspension term reduced by the Administrative Hearing Officer (Code 01.00-R).
- Permit the Administrative Hearing Officer to modify a person's license suspension to allow hunting if there were no hunting-related offenses, or fishing if there were no fishing-related offenses, provided that the person's hunting and fishing licenses, rights, and privileges have not been suspended or revoked within the previous 15 years (Code 01.00-R).
- Create a resident combination hunting/fishing guide license for \$350 (Code 03.14 & Addendum D1.01).
- Prohibit and penalize harassment and public disorder of hunting, fishing or trapping activities (Code 05.37).
- Modify boating restrictions on certain WMAs and NWRs by increasing the penalties for negligent operation from Class 2 to Class 3 & for reckless or intentional operation from Class 3 to Class 4 (Code 20.27).
- Modify wild turkey season dates (Addendum A1.02).
- Modify wild turkey season dates and limits on WMAs (Addendum C1.04).
- Modify Turkey Zone Descriptions (Addendum E1.02).
- Create an exemption from the 16-inch length restriction for largemouth bass on Lakes Barnett, Brewer, and Poinsett during agency-approved fishing tournaments (Addendum N1.02).
- Discussion of access restrictions during duck season on WMAs.

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the June 19, 2025 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any

request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before June 9, 2025. Copies of any proposed rules or regulations may be obtained at the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission main office and at www.agfc.com, or through a written request mailed to the address below.
