

N1.02 Length and Protected Length Limits on Certain Lakes and Rivers

- A. **BLACK BASS:** It is unlawful to possess black bass as follows:
1. Largemouth bass less than 12 inches on Lake Frierson and Greers Ferry Lake.
 2. Spotted bass (Kentucky bass) less than 12 inches on Bull Shoals and Table Rock lakes.
 3. All black bass less than 12 inches in Horseshoe Bend Pool on the Strawberry River.
 4. Largemouth less than 13 inches on Norfolk and Ouachita lakes.
 5. Largemouth bass 13-16 inches on lakes Wilhelmina (Polk County), Bear Creek Lake, Bob Kidd, and Lee Creek.
 6. Largemouth bass less than 13 inches on DeGray Lake and within the boundaries of Felsenthal NWR.
 - i. **EXCEPTION:** No restriction in Woodland Trail Pond – located at the Felsenthal NWR Headquarters on U.S. Highway 82 (Ashley County); Locust Ridge Pond – located at Locust Ridge on U.S. Highway 82 (Union County); Eagle Lake Pond– located north of Eagle Lake on Bradley County Road 53 (Bradley County); and Shallow Lake Field Pond located west of Shallow Lake (Union County). Person(s) keeping largemouth bass less than 13 inches from these waters must exit the NWR boundaries immediately upon leaving these ponds and may not enter NWR campgrounds or fish other NWR waters with largemouth bass less than 13 inches from these 4 ponds in their possession.
 7. Largemouth bass less than 14 inches on the Arkansas River and its tributaries.
 8. Smallmouth bass less than 15 inches on Beaver, Bull Shoals, and Table Rock lakes.
 9. Largemouth bass less than 15 inches on Beaver Lake, Blue Mountain, Bull Shoals, Cane Creek Lake, Georgia Pacific, Kingfisher, and Table Rock lakes; Upper and Lower Lake Chicot (including Connerly Bayou downstream from Connerly Dam to the bayou's mouth and Ditch Bayou from the inlet on Lake Chicot to Ditch Bayou Dam); and Moss Creek Pond.
 10. Black bass greater than 16 inches in Lake Winona.
 11. Largemouth bass 16-21 inches on Lake Atkins. Daily limit 10 (only 1 of which may be longer than 21 inches).
 12. Largemouth bass less than 16 inches on Lake June.
 13. Largemouth bass daily limit 10 (only 1 of which may be longer than 20 inches) on Lake Columbia, Lake Austell (Cross County), Lake Dunn (Cross County), and Lower White Oak Lake.
 14. Largemouth bass daily limit 10 (only 1 of which may be longer than 18 inches) on Lake SWEPCO.
 15. Smallmouth bass less than 18 inches on the lower Little Missouri River from Narrows Dam to its mouth. Daily limit 1.
 16. Largemouth bass 14-17 inches on Mallard Lake. Daily limit 10, only 1 of which may be larger than 17 inches.
 17. Largemouth bass daily limit 10 (only 1 of which may be longer than 16 inches) on Lakes Barnett, Brewer, and Poinsett.
- EXEMPTION:**
- A. Fishing tournament officials may submit a request to the AGFC Fisheries Division for written permission to exempt participants from the 16 inch length restriction. All participants must be given a copy of the permit.
18. Largemouth bass daily limit two (only 1 of which may be longer than 21 inches) on Lake Pickthorne.
- B. **CRAPPIE:** It is unlawful to possess crappie as follows:
1. Less than 10 inches in Beaver, Table Rock, Bull Shoals, and Norfolk reservoirs; Cane Creek Lake in Lincoln County; Lake Chicot (including Connerly Bayou downstream from Connerly Dam to the bayou's mouth and Ditch Bayou from the inlet on Lake Chicot to Ditch Bayou Dam); Lake Erling (including Bodcau Creek downstream of Arkansas Highway 360 Bridge), Lake Overcup, Harris Brake Lake, Lake Dardanelle, and Lake Atkins.
 2. Less than 9 inches on Blue Mountain Lake.
- C. **CATFISH (channel, blue and flathead):** It is unlawful to possess flathead catfish less than 20 inches on the Ouachita River from Sandy Beach Access (Ouachita County) to Remmel Dam.
- D. **PADDLEFISH:** It is unlawful to possess paddlefish less than 34 inches (Eye to Fork Length) on the White River in the special snagging area below Beaver Dam and from the Houseman Access Boat Ramp downstream to the Missouri state line.

- E. **STRIPED BASS:** It is unlawful to possess striped bass less than 20 inches on Lake Norfolk and Beaver Lake
- F. **SHOVELNOSE STURGEON:** It is unlawful to possess shovelnose sturgeon less than 21 inches. Shovelnose sturgeon may not be taken from the Mississippi River.
 - 1. **EXCEPTION:** Sportfish may be snagged (except in catch-and-release areas) in compliance with Codes [26.05](#) and [26.17](#), and within the restrictive size limits in this Addendum chapter.
- G. **WALLEYE:** It is unlawful to possess walleye less than 14 inches on Greers Ferry Lake and its tributaries.

All fish measurements must follow procedures listed in the definition of "Length Limits" in Code 01.00-C.

- WHEREAS,** the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and its staff have proposed the attached regulation amendments to Codes 01.00-R (Administrative Hearing Procedures), 03.14 (Resident Guide License Requirements), 05.37 (Obstruction of Hunting, Fish or Trapping Prohibited), and 20.27 (Boating Restrictions on Certain WMAs and NWRs) of the Commission Code Book and its Addenda A1.02 (Wild Turkey Season and Limits), C1.04 (Wild Turkey Seasons and Limits on WMAs), D1.01 (Licenses, Permits, Stamps, Tags, Costs, and Expiration Dates), E1.02 (Turkey Zone Descriptions), and N1.02 (Length and Protected Length Limits on Certain Lakes and Rivers); **and**
- WHEREAS,** these amendments are needed to (1) address the harassment and public disorder of hunters and others in relation to hunting, fishing, trapping, or boating activities; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Code 03.14 and Addendum D1.01 create a new Resident Combination Guide License (GLC) that costs \$350, expires June 30 each year, and allows Arkansas residents to guide, aid, or assist another person, for pay or other consideration, for hunting and fishing in Arkansas; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Addendum N1.02 authorize the Fisheries Division to, upon request by a fishing tournament official, issue a permit exempting tournament anglers from the 16-inch length restriction on largemouth bass on Lakes Barnett, Brewer, and Poinsett; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Addenda A1.02, C1.04, and E1.02 address the restructuring of wild turkey hunting season dates, harvest limits, and zones, which includes dividing the state into 5 new turkey zones that follow county lines and specifying that each wildlife management area constitutes its own zone, with individual season dates and harvest limits for each zone; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Code 05.37 add a list of specifically prohibited actions (including the obstruction of lawful hunting, fishing, or trapping) and increase the penalty from Class 2 to Class 3 or 4 depending on the nature of the violation; **and**
- WHEREAS,** the amendments to Code 20.27 increase the penalty from Class 3 to Class 4 for recklessly or intentionally operating a motorboat or vessel in a prohibited manner on certain WMAs and NWRs; **and**
- WHEREAS,** a conviction of a Class 3 or 4 violation will result in the suspension of a person's hunting and fishing licenses, rights, and privileges for at least 1 year (for Class 3) or 2 years (for Class 4), and possibly longer if the person also has other points,

which suspension will prohibit the person from entering Commission-owned WMAs and lakes during the term of the suspension; **and**

WHEREAS, the amendments to Code 01.00-R provide that persons convicted of violating Code 05.37 will be ineligible for a reduction of their suspension term but that suspensions imposed more than 15 years ago will not be considered for the purpose of determining eligibility for a reduction provided in Code 01.00-R; **and**

WHEREAS, the attached revised regulations (Codes 01.00-R, 03.14, 05.37, and 20.27; and Addenda A1.02, C1.04, D1.01, E1.02, and N1.02) have been communicated through a variety of media avenues to sportsmen and women and the general public throughout the state for review and comment for at least the past 30 days; **and**


WHEREAS, after carefully considering the recommendations of the Director, Commission staff, and the Regulations Committee, as well as comments received from the public, the Commission has determined that the attached regulations promote sound fish and wildlife conservation and management, are consistent with Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution, and should now be approved for application statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED this 19th day of June 2025, that the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission hereby approves and adopts the attached regulation amendments to Codes 01.00-R (Administrative Hearing Procedures), 03.14 (Resident Guide License Requirements), 05.37 (Obstruction of Hunting, Fish or Trapping Prohibited), and 20.27 (Boating Restrictions on Certain WMAs and NWRs) of the Commission Code Book and its Addenda A1.02 (Wild Turkey Season and Limits), C1.04 (Wild Turkey Seasons and Limits on WMAs), D1.01 (Licenses, Permits, Stamps, Tags, Costs, and Expiration Dates), E1.02 (Turkey Zone Descriptions), and N1.02 (Length and Protected Length Limits on Certain Lakes and Rivers), which shall become effective immediately upon public filing or as soon thereafter as possible.







The regular monthly meeting of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission will be held beginning at 8:00 a.m. Thursday, June 19, 2025, at the Golden Glo Studio located at 1238 Country Club Road, Camden, AR 71701. At that time, regulations and business pertaining to the operation of the Game and Fish Commission and other fiscal and administrative matters will be considered and acted upon. Additionally, Committee meetings attended by Commissioners and agency staff members will be held throughout the day on Wednesday, June 18, 2025, beginning at 12:00 p.m. at the Golden Glo Studio located at 1238 Country Club Road, Camden, AR 71701. All interested persons are invited to attend these meetings.

The Commission meeting on June 19th will be live-streamed and a link for easy viewing access will be available on the agency website. Please visit the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission website at <https://www.agfc.com> for additional up-to-date details as the meeting dates draw closer.

Items on the agenda for the June 19, 2025 meeting will include discussion and/or adoption of proposed regulations that previously were considered at the May 14-15, 2025 Commission Meetings, plus consideration of various Hunting and Fishing Regulations and regulations pertaining to the Enforcement Division of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, including but not limited to:

- Provide that persons convicted of violating Code 05.37 (regarding disorderly conduct while hunting, fishing or trapping) shall not be eligible to have their license suspension term reduced by the Administrative Hearing Officer (Code 01.00-R).
- Permit the Administrative Hearing Officer to modify a person's license suspension to allow hunting if there were no hunting-related offenses, or fishing if there were no fishing-related offenses, provided that the person's hunting and fishing licenses, rights, and privileges have not been suspended or revoked within the previous 15 years (Code 01.00-R).
- Create a resident combination hunting/fishing guide license for \$350 (Code 03.14 & Addendum D1.01).
- Prohibit and penalize harassment and public disorder of hunting, fishing or trapping activities (Code 05.37).
- Modify boating restrictions on certain WMAs and NWRs by increasing the penalties for negligent operation from Class 2 to Class 3 & for reckless or intentional operation from Class 3 to Class 4 (Code 20.27).
- Modify wild turkey season dates (Addendum A1.02).
- Modify wild turkey season dates and limits on WMAs (Addendum C1.04).
- Modify Turkey Zone Descriptions (Addendum E1.02).
- Create an exemption from the 16-inch length restriction for largemouth bass on Lakes Barnett, Brewer, and Poinsett during agency-approved fishing tournaments (Addendum N1.02).
- Discussion of access restrictions during duck season on WMAs.

All persons wishing to be heard on these subjects should submit comments in writing to this office before the start of the June 19, 2025 meeting (preferably by 4:30 p.m. on the day before). Any

request to make an oral presentation at the meeting should be submitted in writing to this office on or before June 9, 2025.
