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1.0 <u>0</u> Regu	latory Authority
1.01	These Rules shall be known as the Arkansas Department of Education, <u>Division Of Elementary And Secondary Education</u> Rules Governing Professional Development.
1.02	Arkansas law requires the following professional development be provided for educators:
	1.02.1 School districts A public school district or open-enrollment public charter school shall provide no less than six (6) professional development days under 3.10 in the basic contract for educators under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-2402;
	1.02.2 Higher Institutions of higher education shall provide professional development within teacher preparation programs on:

1.02.2.1 Child maltreatment, under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-61-133; and

- 1.02.2.2 Dyslexia, under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-41-609—; and
- 1.02.2.3 Code of Ethics, under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-428.
- 1.03 The State Board of Education (SBE) enacts these Rules pursuant to its authority as set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-10-122, 6-10-123, 6-11-105, 6-15-1004, 6-15-1703, 6-17-402, 6-17-701 et seq., 6-17-402, 6-18-2004, 6-20-2204, 6-20-2305, 6-41-609, 6-61-133, and 25-15-201 et seq., and Acts 44 and 1090 of 2015.

2.00 Purposes

- 2.01 It is the purpose of these Rules to develop a high quality professional development system for all educators.
- 2.02 The purpose of professional development is to improve knowledge and skills in order to facilitate individual, team, school-wide, and district-wide improvement designed to ensure that all students demonstrate proficiency on the state academic standards.

3.00 Definitions

- 3.01 "ADE" means the Arkansas Department of Education.
- 3.02-3.01 <u>"Approved Professional Development Provider"</u> –means any organization or individual that provides content for professional development eredit, whether delivered in a face-to-face or electronic mode of delivery, whose content has been approved by the ADE the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education to meet the annual professional development eredit requirements for school employees imposed upon educators by Arkansas Statutes and ADE Rules.
 - 3.02.1 3.01.1 The following entities and agencies are not required to obtain approval as an Approved Professional Development Provider:
 - 3.02.1.1 3.01.1.1 An Arkansas public school district, open-enrollment public charter school or education service cooperative that provides a professional development program solely to its own personnel;
 - 3.02.1.2-3.01.1.2 An Education Cooperative education service cooperative that provides professional development to districts/schools public school districts, public schools, or both; and
 - 3.02.1.3 <u>The Arkansas Department of Education</u>;
 - 3.02.1.4 The Arkansas Department of Career Education; and

- 3.02.1.5 The Arkansas Department of Human Services Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education.
- 3.03 3.02 "ArkansasIDEAS" is Internet Delivered Education for Arkansas Schools, means a partnership between the ADE the division and the Arkansas Educational Television Network (AETN) to provide through the AETN access to high-quality, online professional development for Arkansas licensed educators.
- 3.04 Arkansas Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (ACSIP)—a plan developed by a local school team based on an analysis of student performance data and other relevant data that provides a plan of action to address deficiencies in student performance and any academic achievement gap as evidenced in the Arkansas Comprehensive Assessment Program as defined in ADE rules.
- 3.03 "Collaborative team" means a group of educators who meet to learn, implement, and reflect on research-based techniques in a focus area(s). Members read and discuss current research, examine and reflect on effective instruction, or examine student work.
- 3.05 3.04 "Educator" means any individual holding a license issued by the State Board of Education, specifically including without limitation teachers, administrators, library media specialists, and counselors or any individual employed under a waiver of teacher licensure under Arkansas Code § 6-23-101 et seq, Arkansas Code § 6-15-2801 et seq, Arkansas Code § 6-15-103, or the Standards for Accreditation for Arkansas Public Schools, including without limitation teachers, administrators, library media specialists, and counselors.
- 3.05 "High school equivalency test examiner" means an individual working with a student to assist the student in passing the General Education Development (GED) test under Arkansas Code 6-16-118 or another test used to assess high school core subject competencies that is approved by the state board.
- 3.06 3.06 "Illness" means disorder of health of an educator or an educator's immediate family.
- 3.07-3.07 "Immediate family" means the an educator's:

3.07.1 Spouse;

3.07.2 Child;

3.07.3 Parent; or

3.07.4 3.07.4 Any other relative if the other relative lives in the same household as the educator;

- 3.08 3.08 "LEADS" means the Leader Excellence and Development System under Arkansas Code § 6-17-2806.
- 3.09 <u>"Learning Teams"</u>— <u>means</u> a group of educators who meet regularly as a team to identify essential and valued student learning, develop common formative assessments, analyze current levels of achievement, set achievement goals, share strategies, and then create lessons to improve upon those levels.
- 3.10 <u>"Mentoring/eoaching"</u> —<u>means</u> actions of support and focused feedback designed to increase the capacity for growth of instructional skills and effectiveness of colleagues.
- 3.11 "Microcredential" means personalized, job-embedded, competency-based professional development that leads to professional learning credit, designation, or microcredential badges or any combination of the three.
- 3.12 "Professional development" means a set of coordinated planned learning activities for teachers, administrators, and nonlicensed school employees that:
 - 3.12.1 Is required by statute or by the division; or
 - 3.12.2 Meets the following criteria:
 - 3.12.2.1 Is part of the professional development hours or professional learning credits, as determined by the division, required by law or by the division;
 - 3.12.2.2 Improves the knowledge, skills, and effectiveness of teachers;
 - 3.12.2.3 Improves the knowledge and skills of administrators and paraprofessionals concerning effective instructional strategies, methods, and skills;
 - 3.12.2.4 Leads to improved student academic achievement; and
 - 3.12.2.5 Is research-based and standards-based.
 - 3.12.3 May incorporate educational technology as a component of the professional development, including without limitation taking or teaching an online or blended course; and
 - 3.12.4 May provide educators with knowledge and skills needed to teach:
 - 3.12.4.1 Students with intellectual disabilities, including without limitation Autism Spectrum Disorder;

- 3.12.4.2 Students with specific learning disorders, including without limitation dyslexia;
- 3.12.4.3 Culturally and linguistically diverse students; and
- 3.12.4.4 Gifted students.
- 3.11 3.13 <u>"Professional Development Day development day"</u> —means either six (6) hours of professional development or one professional learning credit equals one (1) professional development day.
- 3.14 "Professional development hour" means a traditional delivery-based method of professional development.
- 3.12 3.15 <u>"Professional Development Plan</u> development plan" —means a plan that outlines the professional development program of activities for a district, school, a public school district or open-enrollment charter school or an educator that is based on student data and is aligned to the ACSIP, and incorporates an educator's professional growth plan.
- 3.13 3.16 "Professional Development Program ("Program") development

 program" means a course of instruction intended to provide content that fulfills the requirement for professional development credit for educators.
- 3.14 3.17 <u>"Professional Growth Plan growth plan"</u> is means an educator's plan for professional growth that:
 - 3.14.1 3.17.1 Identifies professional learning outcomes to advance the educator's professional skills; and
 - 3.14.2 3.17.2 Clearly links professional development activities and the educator's individual professional learning needs identified through TESS or LEADS.
- 3.18 "Professional learning credit" means a method of professional development that may have a nontraditional format such as a micro-credentialing process approved by the division.
- 3.15 Study Groups a group of educators who meet to learn, implement, and reflect on research-based techniques in a focus area(s). Members read and discuss current research, examine and reflect on effective instruction, or examine student work.
- 3.16-3.19 <u>"TESS"</u>— means the Teacher Excellence and Support System in Arkansas Code § 6-17-2801 et seq.

4.00 Professional Development Generally

- 4.01 Professional development is a set of coordinated planned learning activities for educators that:
 - 4.01.1 Improves the knowledge, skills, and effectiveness of teachers, including the ability to apply what is learned;
 - 4.01.2 Improves the knowledge and skills of administrators and paraprofessionals concerning effective instructional strategies, methods, and skills, including the ability to apply what is learned;
 - 4.01.3 Leads to improved student academic achievement;
 - 4.01.4 Is research-based and standards-based;
 - 4.01.5 May incorporate educational technology as a component of the professional development, including without limitation taking or teaching an online or blended course; and
 - 4.01.6 May provide educators with knowledge and skills needed to teach:
 - 4.01.6.1 Students with intellectual disabilities, including without limitation Autism Spectrum Disorder;
 - 4.01.6.2 Students with specific learning disorders, including without limitation dyslexia;
 - 4.01.6.3 Culturally and linguistically diverse students; and
 - 4.01.6.4 Gifted students.
- 4.01 To renew an educator license, a teacher shall participate in continuing education and professional development:
 - 4.01.1 Based on the teacher's evaluation and professional growth plan under the Teacher Excellence and Support System, Arkansas Code § 6-17-2801 et seq.;
 - 4.01.2 As required under Arkansas Code § 6-17-701 et seq.;
 - 4.01.3 As part of a basic contract under Arkansas Code § 6-17-2402; and
 - 4.01.4 As required by these rules.

- 4.02 To renew an expired educator license, the educator shall complete professional development:
 - 4.02.1 Required for licensure under the professional development schedule in Arkansas Code § 6-17-709;
 - 4.02.2 On the educator Code of Ethics, under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-428;
 - 4.02.3 Required for the educator to obtain credentials for proficiency or awareness of the science of reading, as applicable under the Right to Read Act, Arkansas Code § 6-17-429, if those credentials are not already documented in the Arkansas Educator Licensing System.
- 4.02 4.03 The annual professional Professional development requirement must be fulfilled earned between July 1 and June 30 unless the employing school district public school district or open-enrollment charter school approves and documents the professional development year as between June 1 and May 31.
- 4.03 4.04 Approved professional development activities that Professional development occur earned during the instructional day or outside the educator's annual contract days may apply toward the annual minimum required professional development requirement.
- 4.04 4.05 Any educator who misses any part of regularly scheduled professional development activities for any reason (such as illness) must make up that time in other approved professional development activities so that the hours of professional development required annually are earned during the approved time frame required under Section section 4.02 of these Rules this rule, except as provided below:
 - 4.04.1 4.05.1 If the educator is absent because of illness of the educator or the educator's immediate family, the educator shall be allowed to make up the hours missed during the remainder of the current school year or succeeding school year.
 - 4.04.2 4.05.2 An educator shall complete any missed hours of professional development through professional development that is:
 - 4.04.2.1 4.05.2.1 Substantially similar to the professional development missed and approved by the person responsible for the educator's summative evaluation; and
 - 4.04.2.2 4.05.2.2 Delivered by any method, online or otherwise, that is approved by ADE the division under these Rules this rule.

4.05 4.06 Any educator who provides approved professional development approved by the division may count two (2) hours professional development credit for each one (1) hour of time spent in presenting professional development content, if approved by the educator's public school district or open-enrollment public charter school.

4.06 <u>4.07</u> College Courses

- 4.06.1 Five (5) hours of credit for professional development shall be given for each one (1) hour of college credit for a graduate-level course, if the college credit:
 - 4.06.1.1 Is related to and enhances the educator's knowledge of the subject area in which the educator is currently employed and is related to the educator's professional growth plan;
 - 4.06.1.2 Is part of the requirement for the educator to obtain additional certification in a subject matter that has been designated by the ADE as having a critical shortage of educators; or
 - 4.06.1.3 Is otherwise approved by the ADE as a graduate level course eligible for professional development credit.
- 4.06.2 Professional development obtained under Section 4.06.1 may be allocated as follows:
 - 4.06.2.1 Up to fifteen (15) hours may be credited to the professional development requirements for licensure; and
 - 4.06.2.2 Hours obtained in excess of fifteen (15) may be credited to any remaining requirements for professional development generally, if approved by the school district in a professional development plan.
- 4.06.3 4.08 The allocation of professional development credit obtained under Section 4.06.1 4.06 shall be approved by the:
 - 4.06.3.1 4.08.1 School district or public charter school Public school district or open-enrollment public charter school employing the teacher; or
 - 4.06.3.2 4.08.2 Department Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, if the educator is not employed by a school district or public charter school a public school district or openenrollment public charter school.

- 4.06.4 Graduate level courses in educational leadership are eligible for professional development credit based on approval by the ADE. The focus of the course must specifically relate to the job assignment as approved by the employing educational agency.
- 4.07 4.09 An educator may earn up to twelve (12) hours of professional development credit approved by the school or school district, which may be applied toward the professional development requirement for the time period at the beginning of each school year that is used to plan and prepare curriculum or develop other instructional material. Educators shall be entitled to one (1) hour of professional development credit for each hour of approved preparation under this section, provided the educator spends the time:
 - 4.07.1 4.09.1 In his/her his or her instructional classroom, office or media center at the public school; and
 - 4.07.2 4.09.2 Prior to the first student teacher interaction day of the school year; and
 - 4.07.3 <u>4.09.3</u> In the focus areas listed in Section 8.02. of these Rules, and may include but is not limited to time spent in the following areas:
 - 4.07.3.1 Grade level and/or vertical team planning to integrate subject areas;
 - 4.07.3.2 Team work to analyze student data;
 - 4.07.3.3 Team work to develop academic improvement plans (AIP) or individual educational programs (IEP);
 - 4.07.3.4 Developing and/or revising curriculum, including studentcentered units and assessments aligned to state curriculum frameworks;
 - 4.07.3.5 Professional book studies;
 - 4.07.3.6 Developing intervention strategies to support remediation and/or acceleration:
 - 4.07.3.7 Developing and/or revising the Arkansas Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (ACSIP);
 - 4.07.3.8 Pursuing study as noted in an educator's professional growth plan;

- 4.07.3.9 ArkansasIDEAS on-line professional development related to ACSIP or the educator's professional growth plan.
 - 4.07.3.9.1 An educator who obtains professional development from ArkansasIDEAS for the purpose of this subsection 4.07.3.9 may also use ArkansasIDEAS to obtain other professional development under these Rules.
- 4.07.8 No professional development credit shall be given for activities under Section 4.07 of these Rules unless those activities meet the criteria and standard requirements under Sections 8.01 and 8.02 of these Rules. Specific activities which do not qualify include without limitation:
 - 4.07.8.1 Making and putting up bulletin boards;
 - 4.07.8.2 Clerical work associated with documents such as ACSIP, AIP and IEPs; and
 - 4.07.8.3 Administrative faculty or team administrative meetings.
- 4.08 4.10 Educators may count up to two (2) professional development days for attendance at instructional professional development sessions conducted by bona fide professional organizations and approved by ADE the division under A.C.A. § 6-17-702.
- 4.09 4.11 Nothing in this Section 4 shall prevent or restrict a school district a public school district or open-enrollment public charter school from requiring additional in-service training.

5.0 Minimum Annual Requirements

- 5.01 Each educator shall obtain thirty-six (36) hours of professional development annually for renewal of an educator's license.
- 5.02 The thirty-six (36) professional development hours under this section shall include, at a minimum:
 - 5.02.1 The professional development required in the educator's professional growth plan under the requirements of TESS or LEADS; and
 - 5.02.2 Professional development required by law or by rule.

6.0 5.00 Scheduled Professional Development

- $6.01 \underline{5.01}$ The professional development required under this Section 6 $\underline{5}$ shall include content that is provided by:
 - 6.01.1-5.01.1 ADE The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, including ArkansasIDEAS;
 - 6.01.2 5.01.2 An institution of higher education;
 - 6.01.3 5.01.3 A provider approved by ADE the division; or
 - 6.01.4 5.01.4 An education service cooperative.
- 6.02 5.02 The two (2) hours in each area of professional development required under this Section 6 section shall be counted in for the school year in which that the professional development is taken earned toward the minimum number of hours of required professional development required for educators for that school year.
- 6.03 5.03 If an educator obtains earns additional hours above professional development beyond the minimum requirements of this Section 6 section, the educator may count those the additional hours professional development toward the total minimum hours of required professional development required for educators for that school year.
- 6.04 5.04 As part of the minimum annual requirement under these Rules, a public school or school district A public school district or open-enrollment public charter school shall make available to the appropriate educator, or an educator not employed by a public school or school district a public school district or open-enrollment public charter school shall obtain, required professional development.
 - 6.04.1 Child Maltreatment Mandated Reporter 5.04.1 Professional development required within one year of receiving a teaching license shall include:
 - 6.04.1.1 In the 2013-2014 school year and every fourth <u>fifth</u> year thereafter, all educators shall obtain two (2) hours of professional development in: 5.04.1.1 Two hours of professional development for mandated reporters, which covers:
 - 6.04.4.1.1 5.04.1.1.a Recognizing the signs and symptoms of child maltreatment;
 - 6.04.4.1.2 5.04.1.1.b The legal requirements of the Child Maltreatment Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 12-18-101 et seq., and the duties of mandated reporters under the Act;

- 6.04.4.1.3 5.04.1.1.c Methods for managing disclosures regarding child victims; and
- 6.04.4.1.4-5.04.1.1.d Methods for connecting a victim of child maltreatment to appropriate in-school services and other agencies, programs, and services needed to provide the child with the emotional and educational support the child needs to continue to be successful in school.
- 6.04.1.2 5.04.1.1.e The child maltreatment professional development required under this section shall be based on curriculum approved by the Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission and may be obtained earned in-person or online.

6.04.2 Parent Involvement

- 5.04.1.2 Two hours of professional development on family and community engagement
- 6.04.2.1 In the 2014-2015 school year and every fourth school year thereafter, each 5.04.1.2.a Each educator shall be required to have two (2) hours of professional development designed to enhance understanding of effective parent involvement family and community engagement strategies.
- 6.04.2.2 5.04.1.2.b In the 2014-2015 school year and every fourth school year thereafter, each administrator shall be required to have two (2) hours of professional development designed to enhance understanding of effective parent involvement strategies and the importance of administrative leadership in setting expectations and creating a climate conducive to parent participation. If the appropriate licensed personnel has completed the family and community engagement professional development required under this section at least one (1) time before the 2023-2024 school year, he or she shall not be required to complete the family and community engagement professional development again.
- 6.04.3 5.04.1.3 Teen Suicide Awareness and Prevention Two hours of professional development on mental health awareness and teen suicide awareness and prevention

- 6.04.3.1 In the 2015-2016 school year and every fourth school year thereafter, all educators shall obtain two (2) hours of professional development in teen suicide awareness and prevention.
- 6.04.3.2 5.04.1.3.a The required professional development under this section may be accomplished by self-review of suitable mental health awareness and suicide prevention materials approved by ADE the division.

6.04.4 Arkansas History

- 6.04.4.1 In the 2016-2017 school year and every fourth school year thereafter, each educator who provides instruction in Arkansas history shall obtain two (2) hours of professional development in Arkansas history.
- 5.04.1.4 Two hours of professional development in Arkansas history for educators providing instruction in Arkansas history.
 - 5.04.1.4.a If the appropriate licensed personnel has completed the
 Arkansas history professional development required under
 subdivision of this section at least one (1) time before the 20232024 school year, he or she shall not be required to complete the
 Arkansas history professional development again, except as
 may be required for the subject matter he or she teaches.
- 5.04.1.5 Thirty (30) minutes of professional development in human trafficking prevention, including:
 - 5.04.15.a Recognizing the warning signs that a child is a victim of human trafficking; and
 - 5.04.1.5.b Reporting a suspicion that a child is a victim of human trafficking.
- 5.04.1.6 Two (2) hours of professional development in bullying prevention, including:
 - 5.04.1.6.a Recognition of the relationship between incidents of bullying and the risk of suicide.
- 5.04.1.7 Dyslexia professional awareness, including:
 - 5.04.1.7.a The characteristics of dyslexia; and

- 5.04.1.7.b The evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia.
- 5.05 In addition to the professional development required for initial licensure, the following rotating schedule shall apply:
 - 5.05.1 Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year and every fifth year thereafter, an educator shall be required to earn the professional development on mental health awareness and teen suicide awareness and prevention required under 5.04.1.3.
 - 5.05.2 Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, and every fifth year thereafter, an educator shall be required to earn the professional development in bullying prevention required under 5.04.1.6.
 - 5.05.3 Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, and every fifth year thereafter, an educator shall be required to earn the professional development for mandated reporters required under 5.04.1.1
- 5.06 The professional development in human trafficking prevention under 5.04.1.5 will be offered annually.
- 5.07 The required professional development under this section shall count toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional development in the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts and for licensure requirements for licensed personnel.

7.0 6.00 Requirements for Specific Licensure Areas

7.01 6.01 Administrator

- 7.01.1 For each administrator, the annual required professional development requirement shall include training in data disaggregation, instructional leadership, and fiscal management.
- 7.01.2 6.01.1 This training may include without limitation the Initial, Tier 1, and Tier 2 training required for superintendents and district designees by the Arkansas Department of Education Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Rules Governing the Arkansas Financial Accounting and Reporting System and Annual Training Requirements.
- 7.01.3 <u>6.01.2</u> An applicant for a building-level administrator license shall successfully complete the teacher evaluation professional development program.

7.01.3.1–6.01.2.1 An educator who receives an initial building level administrator's license shall complete the credentialing assessment for the teacher evaluation professional development program either before or after receiving the initial building level administrator's license.

7.02 6.02 Athletic Coaches

At least once every three (3) years, each person employed as an athletic coach shall obtain training in recognition and management regarding each of the following events or conditions that may be encountered by a student during athletic training and physical activities:

7.02.1 6.02.1 A concussion, dehydration, or other health emergency;

7.02.2 6.02.2 An environmental issue that threatens the health or safety of students; and

7.02.3 6.02.3 A communicable disease.

7.02.4 6.02.4 The training may include a component on best practices for a coach to educate parents of students involved in athletics on sports safety.

7.03 6.03 Advanced Placement

Each hour of approved training received by educators related to teaching an advanced placement class for a subject covered by the College Board and Educational Testing Service shall count as professional development up to a maximum of thirty (30) hours annually.

7.04 6.04 Adult Education

Educators working solely part_time in one of the following settings shall obtain one-half (1/2) of the required hours of professional development annually for licensure.

7.04.1 6.04.1 Adult basic education;

7.04.2 6.04.2 General adult education;

7.04.3 6.04.3 English as a second language for adults; and

7.04.4 6.04.4 General Educational Development Test examiners.

8.0 7.00 Professional Development Criteria

- 8.01 7.01 All approved professional development shall be aligned to the standards developed by the State Board of Education.
- 8.02 7.02 Approved professional development activities shall relate to the following Focus Areas focus areas:
 - 8.02.1 7.02.1 Content (K-12);
 - 8.02.2 7.02.2 Instructional strategies;
 - 8.02.3 7.02.3 Assessment/data driven decision making Student assessment and data-driven decisionmaking;
 - 8.02.4 7.02.4 Advocacy/leadership/fiscal management Advocacy, leadership, and fiscal management;
 - 8.02.5 7.02.5 Systemic change process;
 - 8.02.6 7.02.6 Standards, frameworks, and curriculum alignment;
 - 8.02.7 7.02.7 Supervision;
 - 8.02.8 7.02.8 Mentoring/peer coaching;
 - 8.02.9 7.02.9 Next generation learning/integrated technology Next-generation learning and technology integration;
 - 8.02.10 7.02.10 Principles of learning/developmental stages/diverse learners Principles of learning and developmental stages;
 - 8.02.11 Cognitive research;
 - 8.02.12 7.02.12 Parent involvement/academic planning and scholarship Family and community engagement and academic planning;
 - 8.02.13 <u>7.02.13</u> Collaborative <u>professional</u> learning community;
 - 8.02.14 7.02.14 Student health and wellness, which may include but is not limited to:
 - 8.02.14.1 7.02.14.1 Antibullying policies;

- 8.02.14.2 7.02.14.2 Appropriate training for anticipated rescuers in the use of automated external defibrillator or cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- 8.02.15 7.02.15 The Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators.
- 8.03 7.03 Approved professional development takes on many forms and may be earned in the following ways:
 - 8.03.1 7.03.1 Conferences/workshops/institutes Conferences, workshops, or institutes;
 - 8.03.2 7.03.2 Mentoring/peer coaching Mentoring or peer coaching;

- 10.04 9.04 Upon notification by the ADE the division of approval of the program (or a part or parts thereof) for professional development credit, the professional development provider may enroll participants in the program and offer the program for professional development credit for the set time period.
- 10.05 9.05 The program provider shall be responsible for the preparation and dissemination of proof of completion of the program, (or parts thereof), to all attendees. All such proofs, or copies thereof, shall be submitted by the attendees who are employed by an Arkansas school district a public school district or openenrollment public charter school to the superintendent of the district, or the chief executive of the open-enrollment public charter school.

- 12.01 11.01 Each school district public school district or open-enrollment public charter school shall maintain all documents for its employees that reflect completion of professional development programs, whether such those programs were provided by an outside organization or by the district public school district or open-enrollment public charter school itself.
- 12.02 Each school district public school district or open-enrollment public charter school shall report the amount of all professional development programs completed by its employees to the ADE the Division of Elementary and

- <u>Secondary Education</u> at the time and in the manner specified by the <u>ADE</u> the division.
- <u>12.03</u> 11.03 The ADE The division may monitor all school districts public school districts or open-enrollment public charter schools, and all educators to whom these Rules apply, for compliance with these requirements, and may administer appropriate sanctions specified in statute and Rule as authorized by law, including the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators, to any district public school district, open-enrollment public charter school, or educator whom it finds to be in noncompliance or for dishonesty in to have falsified reporting under these Rules.
 - 12.03.1 Regular monitoring activities of the professional development requirements within these Rules shall occur when the superintendent of the school district or the chief executive of the open-enrollment public charter school provides written assurance to the Commissioner of Education as required by law. However, the ADE the division may directly monitor the professional development activities of any school or school district public school district or open-enrollment public charter school to determine compliance with the professional development requirements.
- 12.04 The criteria for evaluating the impact of professional development in a public school or school district ACSIP plan shall be the improvement of student achievement on state-mandated assessments, other related indicators as defined by ACTAAP and next generation assessments, and the evaluations of the professional development offerings. These data shall be used to revise ACSIP and the district, school and individual professional development plans associated with the local improvement plan.
- 12.05 11.04 All institutions of higher education shall maintain documentation for employees who wish to meet the professional development hours to maintain a license under these rules.

DISCUSSION

This rule is being amended to remove outdated language referencing the Arkansas Comprehensive Testing, Assessment, and Accountability Program Act which was repealed by Act 930 of 2017. The rule language is also being amended to remove some of the barriers to professional development by including a process by which educators can earn professional development through a micocredential or a specific course instead of only being able to earn professional development through hours of orientation. The rule amendment also removes some of the unnecessary structure for professional development, allowing district to be more flexible and innovative in providing professional development, and educators to be more flexible in meeting requirements. Finally, the rule amendment adds language to comply with laws requiring professional in several key subject areas, including bullying prevention, and human trafficking prevention, mental health awareness, and family and community engagement.

Post-public comment, several substantive and non-substantive changes were made. Substantive changes include: amending the rule to allow for education service cooperatives to provide professional development to their own staff; to allow for a district or open-enrollment charter that is under Level 5 - intensive support to be required to undertake specific professional development, and to correct legal citations.

RECOMMENDATION

The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education recommends Governor's Office approval of this rule.
