I. DEFINITIONS.

As used in these Rules:

- (1) (A) “Applicant” means a person that has applied to the Office of Driver Services for issuance or renewal of an Arkansas driver’s license or identification card.
(B) “Applicant” includes a person that has applied to the Office of Driver Services for an amendment of gender information contained on the person’s Arkansas driver’s license or state-issued identification card under Rule IV of these Rules.
- (2) “Driver’s license” means a commercial or non-commercial Arkansas driver’s license issued by the Office of the Driver Services.
- (3) “Gender information” means the sex of an Applicant as stated on the Applicant’s identity document.
- (4) “Identification card” means the card issued for identification purposes only by the Office of Driver Services under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-16-805.
- (5) “Identity document” means an Applicant’s:
 - (A) Original birth certificate;
 - (B) Amended birth certificate;
 - (C) Passport; or
 - (D) Identification document issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
- (6) “Office” means the Office of Driver Services of the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration.

II. VERIFICATION OF APPLICANT INFORMATION UPON RENEWAL OF A DRIVER’S LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION CARD.

An Applicant shall verify to the Office that the following information contained within records of the Office is correct upon the renewal of the Applicant’s driver’s license or identification card:

- (a) The Applicant’s full legal name;
- (b) The Applicant’s date of birth;

- (c) The Applicant's gender information; and
- (d) The Applicant's address of residence.

III. GENDER INFORMATION REQUIRED TO BE STATED ON A DRIVER'S LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION CARD.


- (a) A driver's license or identification card issued by the Office shall state the Applicant's gender information as "M" (male) or "F" (female).
- (b) Except as provided under subsection (d)(1) of this Rule, a driver's license or identification card issued by the Office shall contain the same gender information as stated on the Applicant's identity document.
- (c) The Office shall not issue a driver's license or identification card that contains:
 - (1) Gender information stated as "X"; or
 - (2) No gender information.
- (d) (1) If an Applicant provides an identity document with an application for a driver's license or identification card that contains no gender information or gender information stated as "X", on a form provided by the Office, the Applicant shall state the Applicant's gender information as "M" (male) or "F" (female).
 - (2) (A) The Applicant's driver's license or identification card issued or renewed by the Office shall state the same gender information as the form completed by the Applicant under subsection (d)(1) of this Rule.
 - (B) The Applicant may subsequently amend the gender information contained on the Applicant's driver's license or identification card by submitting the form and documentation required under subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2) of Rule IV of these Rules.
 - (3) If the Applicant does not provide the Office with the completed form required under subsection (d)(1) of this Rule, the Office shall not issue the driver's license or identification card to the Applicant.

IV. AMENDMENT OF GENDER INFORMATION ON A DRIVER'S LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION CARD.

- (a) (1) On a form provided by the Office, an Applicant may request the Office amend the gender information contained on the Applicant's driver's license or identification card.
 - (2) The Applicant shall submit with the form an original or certified copy of an amended birth certificate issued by:
 - (A) The Arkansas Department of Health under Ark. Code Ann. § 20-18-307; or
 - (B) The vital records office of another state or governmental agency.

- (b) (1) The Office shall not grant an application for change of gender information unless the Applicant:
- (A) Completes the form provided under subsection (a)(1) of this Rule;
 - and
 - (B) Submits the documentation required by subsection (a)(2) of this Rule.
- (2) If the Office approves the application for amendment of gender information, the Office may issue to the Applicant an amended duplicate:
- (A) Driver's license upon the payment of the fee under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-16-806 provided that the Applicant's driving privileges are not currently suspended or revoked; or
 - (B) Identification card upon the payment of the fee provided under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-16-805.
- (c) If the Office denies an application to amend gender information submitted under this Rule, the Office shall state its reasons for the denial in writing and forward a copy of the denial letter to the Applicant via 1st Class U.S. Mail.
- (d) (1) If the records of the Office contain a record of an unexpired driver's license or identification card that has been issued with gender information stated as "X", the Office may amend the person's record to reflect gender information as "M" (male) or "F" (female) to correspond to the identity document records of the Applicant kept by the Office.
- (2) If the Office amends the gender information contained within a person's driver's license or identification card record under subsection (d)(1) of this Rule, the Office shall notify the person in writing via 1st Class U.S. Mail.
- (e) A driver's license or identification card that has been amended under this Rule shall contain the person's amended gender information upon the:
- (1) Renewal of the driver's license or identification card; or
 - (2) Issuance of a duplicate driver's license or identification card.

 - (C) Passport; or
 - (D) Identification document issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
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- (a) The Applicant’s full legal name;
- (b) The Applicant’s date of birth;
- (c) The Applicant’s gender information; and
- (d) The Applicant’s address of residence.

III. GENDER INFORMATION REQUIRED TO BE STATED ON A DRIVER'S LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION CARD.



- (c) The Office shall not issue a driver's license or identification card that contains:
 - (1) Gender information stated as "X"; or
 - (2) No gender information.
- (d)

Re: Proposed Emergency Rule – Gender Information Required to be Displayed on an Arkansas Driver's License or State-Issued Identification Card

Ms. Garrity:

Enclosed is a proposed emergency rule with necessary attachments for the Office of Driver Services of the Department of Finance and Administration (Office). The effect of this rule would require that a driver's license or state-issued identification card issued by the Office contain the person's gender information stated as "M" (male) or "F" (female) and correspond with the gender information contained on the person's birth certificate, passport, or identification document issued by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS). The rule also provides the Office with an application process for a person to amend the gender information contained on a driver's license or identification card upon presentation of an original or certified copy of an amended birth certificate issued by the Arkansas Department of Health or the vital records office of another state or governmental agency. The rule would prohibit the Office from issuing a driver's license or identification card that states gender information as "X". For driver's licenses and identification cards previously issued by the Office that contain gender information stated as "X", the rule would provide the Office with the authority to modify gender information to correspond with the person's birth certificate, passport, or DHS identity document contained in the records of the Office.


The Department has determined that an emergency rule is necessary in order to administer the Office's responsibilities under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-16-1104(3), which requires that a driver's license or identification card issued by the Office contain the person's gender. The Office has permitted the holder of a driver's license or identification to choose to indicate "M" (male) or "F" (female) on the person's driver's license or identification card although the person's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document provides differing gender information. The Office has also permitted driver's licenses and identification cards to state gender information as "X" instead of "M" (male) or "F" (female), which this rule would prohibit. This rule is necessary to ensure that individuals and organizations that rely upon identifying information contained within a driver's license or identification card are provided with the most accurate and complete gender information that reflects the person's gender information stated within the holder's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document. In addition, the rule is necessary to provide the Office with the procedures to modify gender information contained in a driver's license or identification card.

**Proposed Rule Regarding Gender Information Required to be Displayed
on an Arkansas Driver's License or State Identification Card**

March 7, 2024

PURPOSE

The Secretary of the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration (Secretary) is seeking Governor Sanders' review of this proposed rule to clarify the requirement of Ark. Code Ann. § 27-16-1104(3) that each driver's license and identification card issued by DFA contains information regarding the person's gender.

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Secretary under Ark. Code Ann. §§ 25-8-102(a) and 27-16-1108, the Secretary, with the approval of the Governor, will administer the requirements of Ark. Code Ann. § 27-16-1104(3) consistent with this rule by requiring each driver's license and identification card issued by the Office of Driver Services of the Department of Finance and Administration (Office) to state the person's gender as "M" (male) or "F" (female) consistent with information contained on the person's birth certificate, passport, or identification document issued by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and no longer permit "X" to be stated on the person's driver's license.

KEY POINTS

The proposed rule:

- Requires that a driver's license or identification card issued or renewed by the Office contain the same gender information of "M" (male) or "F" (female) as stated on the person's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document;
- Prohibits the Office from issuing or renewing a driver's license or identification card that contains gender information that is different than the person's gender information stated on the person's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document or states "X" or "blank" as the person's gender information;
- Authorizes the Office to amend the gender information contained on a person's driver's license or identification card upon presentation of an original or certified copy of an amended birth certificate issued by the Arkansas Department of Health or the vital records office of another state or governmental agency;
- Authorizes the Office to change the "X" gender information contained on a previously-issued Arkansas driver's license or identification card based upon the birth certificate, passport, or DHS document records kept by the Office; and

- Requires that an applicant for a driver's license or identification card provide gender information to the Office as either "M" (male) or "F" (female) in circumstances where the applicant's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document do not contain "M" (male) or "F" (female) gender information.

DISCUSSION


Arkansas law requires that a driver's license or identification card include, at a minimum, identifying information of the holder concerning the person's full legal name, date of birth, address of residence, signature, and gender. Identifying information contained within a driver's license or identification card is utilized by law enforcement, for voting, for travel purposes, for conducting financial transactions, and obtaining insurance and health care services, among other uses.

The Office has permitted the holder of a driver's license or identification to choose to indicate "M" (male) or "F" (female) on the driver's license or identification card although the person's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document provides differing gender information. The Office has also permitted driver's licenses and identification cards to state gender information as "X" instead of "M" (male) or "F" (female). The purpose of this rule to ensure that individuals and organizations that rely upon identifying information contained within a driver's license or identification card are provided with the most accurate and complete gender information that reflects the person's gender information stated within the holder's birth certificate, passport, or DHS document.

RECOMMENDATION

The Department of Finance and Administration recommends Governor's Office approval of this rule.

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DFA Announces Steps to Safeguard Driver's Licenses and IDs *Licenses and IDs will reflect gender listed on birth certificate*

LITTLE ROCK, Arkansas (March 12, 2024) – The Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) today announced a revised policy intended to better safeguard the integrity of licenses and IDs issued by DFA. Effective immediately, DFA is rescinding its existing administrative practice that allows license holders to change their gender without any verifiable information, or to utilize an "X" in lieu of gender. This action restores DFA's long-standing policy that license and ID holders must display a gender of "male" or "female," as indicated on an original or amended birth certificate.

"This policy is just common sense. Only women give birth, men shouldn't play women's sports, and there are only two genders. As long as I'm Governor, Arkansas state government will not endorse nonsense," said Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders.

All previously issued licenses and IDs with the "X" designation will remain valid through the existing expiration date. Updates will take place at renewal.

"This change announced today reflects a commonsense approach that ensures a license or ID issued by the State of Arkansas is based on objective, verifiable information," said DFA Secretary Jim Hudson. "All of our stakeholders in law enforcement, other government agencies, caregivers, schools, and businesses depend on DFA-issued licenses and IDs to keep our communities safe and to prevent fraud. The discontinued policy is not supported by Arkansas law and was never subject to public comment and review by the Arkansas Legislative Council (ALC), as required by the Administrative Procedures Act."

DFA has submitted an emergency rule for review by ALC's Executive Subcommittee. The proposed rule specifies the process DFA will follow to validate a license or ID holder's gender. "We are committed to implementing this new policy in a manner that is respectful towards all of our customers," said Secretary Hudson.

There are 2,668,881 active Arkansas driver's licenses along with 503,294 IDs. More than 600,000 of those are in the form of a REAL ID, which will be required to board a plane or enter a federal building beginning May 7, 2025.
