Proposed Rule Regarding New OAL Operational Rule Regarding Procedures and Funding Requirements for Scholarships and to Establish the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account

July 15, 2022

Purpose

The Department of Finance and Administration Office of the Arkansas Lottery (OAL) is seeking Governor Hutchinson's review of a proposed new rule to OAL's Operational Rules.

Background

Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §23-115-207 OAL has the authority to promulgate administrative rules concerning the Lottery. Act 636 of 2021, and specifically Ark. Code Ann. §23-115-103(B) provides that OAL "shall promulgate rules to determine the manner in which the net proceeds are deposited and disbursed based on what is most financially prudent." Consequently, OAL is proposing a new rule to be added to its operational rules addressing how lottery proceeds are to be deposited and disbursed and has created a Lottery Scholarship Trust Account as required by the legislation.

Key Points

The proposed rule:

- •establishes the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account as required by the legislation. This account was funded by the transfer of monies from the Education Trust Fund and the Arkansas Workforce/Concurrent Scholarship Trust Fund
- •provides for transferring and depositing of lottery proceeds for the funding of scholarships
- •provides that OAL shall follow the investment policy guidelines of the State Board of Finance in selecting a financial institution and managing the net proceeds from the lottery which are deposited in the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account.

Discussion

As is noted in the Key Points section above.

Recommendation

OAL recommends that the rule be approved and adopted.

PROPOSED RULE:

- 13. **Net Proceeds and Funding Scholarships** 13.1. By Act 636 of 2021, the Arkansas Legislature amended the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery Act and established procedures and funding requirements for the creation or amendment of scholarships funded with net revenue available. The Office of the Arkansas Lottery (OAL) was charged with promulgating rules to determine the manner in which the net proceeds from the lottery are deposited and disbursed based on what is most financially prudent. The provisions in this Section of the Operational Rules of the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery are adopted pursuant thereto.
- 13.2. The OAL shall establish the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account to fund the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, and any other scholarship funded with net proceeds from the lottery at a financial institution into which the OAL shall transfer: 13.2.1. Excess funding returned to the OAL under Ark. Code Ann. §6-85- 212(d)(2)(B)(i) from the previous academic year; and
- 13.2.2. Net proceeds remaining in Lottery Scholarship Trust Account from the previous academic year after the OAL: 13.2.2.1. Transfers funds requested by the Division of Higher Education; and,
- 13.2.2.2 Deposits the requisite amount necessary into the Scholarship Shortfall Reserve Trust Account to maintain an amount equal to twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000).
- 13.3. On or before the fifteenth day of each month, the OAL shall deposit the net proceeds from the OAL into the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account at one or more financial institutions.
- 13.4. The OAL shall follow the investment policy guidelines of the State Board of Finance in selecting a financial institution and managing the net proceeds from the OAL deposited into the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account.
- 13.5. The funds transferred by the OAL into the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account for the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program and any other scholarship program shall be used for: 13.5.1. The Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program;
- 13.5.2. The Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program;
- 13.5.3. The Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program;
- 13.5.4. Any other scholarship funded with net proceeds from the OAL; and,
- 13.5.5. Any management fees charged by the financial institution to manage the trust account.
- 13.6. The Director of the Division of Higher Education shall certify to the OAL the amount of net proceeds from the OAL needed to fund scholarships awarded to recipients for each semester of the academic year based on the contents of the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account at the end of the immediately preceding fiscal year.

- 13.7. The OAL shall transfer the funds requested by the Director of Division of Higher Education into one or more trust accounts at one or more financial institutions maintained by Division of Higher Education.
- 13.8. Annually, the Division of Higher Education shall transfer to the OAL the unused funds from the previous academic year, if any, that were transferred by the OAL to fund the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, Ark. Code Ann. §6-85-201 et seq., the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, Ark. Code Ann. §6-85-301 et seq., the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, Ark. Code Ann, §6-85-401 et seq., and any other scholarship program.
- 13.9. Ark. Code Ann. §23-115-802 (b) and (c), concerning the amount deposited into the Scholarship Shortfall Reserve Trust Account and loans made to the Division of Higher Education for the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, shall be administered as follows pursuant to the OAL's operational rules: 13.9.1. An amount equal to four percent (4%) of the total amount of net proceeds disbursed during the preceding fiscal year in the form of scholarships and grants for higher education shall be deposited from lottery proceeds each year until the amount in the account equals twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000); thereafter, only the amount necessary to maintain the account in an amount equal to twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) shall be deposited into the account. Any amount in the account exceeding twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) shall be considered net proceeds and shall be deposited annually into one or more trust accounts at one or more financial institutions by July 1st of each year.
- 13.9.2. If net proceeds in any year are not sufficient to meet the amount allocated for scholarships under the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, Ark. Code Ann. §6-85-201 et seq., the account may be drawn upon to meet the deficiency.

3	the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-301 et seq., or
4	the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-401 et seq., is
5	the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by the
6	General Assembly's delineating such funding allocations for the various
7	scholarship programs, with the approval of the Administrative Rules
8	Subcommittee of the Legislative Council and through oversight as required by
9	law by the Lottery Oversight Subcommittee of the Legislative Council.
10	Further, the General Assembly determines that the division may operate more
11	efficiently with some flexibility, therefore it is both necessary and
12	appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior
13	approval of the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee as provided
14	by this section.
15	(B) If the division determines it is necessary to borrow
16	from the account to fund scholarships under the Arkansas Academic Challenge
17	Scholarship Program, § 6-85-201 et seq., the Arkansas Workforce Challenge
18	Scholarship Program, § 6-85-301 et seq., or the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge
19	Scholarship Program, § 6-85-401 et seq., the division shall first obtain
20	review and approval from the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly
21	is in session, the Joint Budget Committee.
22	
23	SECTION 8. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY.
24	(a) The contents of the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account as
25	established under § 23-115-801 at the end of the 2021 fiscal year shall be
26	used to fund scholarships awarded to recipients of only the following
27	scholarships for the 2021-2022 academic year:
28	(1) Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-201
29	et seq.;
30	(2) Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-301
31	et_seq; and
32	(3) Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-
33	<u>401 et seg.</u>
34	(b)(l) Thereafter, funds that accrue in the Lottery Scholarship Trust
35	Account as established under § 23-115-801 shall be used to fund recipients of
36	the following scholarships:

1	(A) Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-
2	85-201 et seq.;
3	(B) Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-
4	85-301 et seq.;
5	(C) Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, §
6	6-85-401 et seq.; and
7	(D) Any other scholarship funded with net proceeds from
8	the state lottery.
9	(2) Scholarships funded with net proceeds from the state lottery
10	deposited into the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account established under § 23-
11	115-801 shall be funded based on the total amount of net proceeds from the
12	state lottery in the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account at the end of the
13	immediately preceding fiscal year.
14	
15	SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 6 of this act is effective on and
16	<u>after July 1, 2021.</u>
17	
18	SECTION 10. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY.
19	The requirement under § 6-85-501 of this act that the following bills
20	be introduced in the General Assembly during the first thirty-one (31)
21	calendar days of a regular session shall take effect on and after July 1,
22	<u>2021:</u>
23	(1) A bill that creates a new scholarship to be funded with net
24	proceeds from the state lottery or the Higher Education Grants Fund Account,
25	as applicable; and
26	(2) A bill that affects an existing scholarship that is funded
27	with net proceeds from the state lottery or the Higher Education Grants Fund
28	Account, as applicable.
29	
30	SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
31	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is imperative to ensure
32	existing scholarships can be funded with current available funds; that it is
33	necessary to determine whether enacting a new scholarship is fiscally
34	prudent; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to review each
35	bill that creates or amends a lottery-funded scholarship in light of existing
36	scholarships and available funds to ensure financial solvency of the lottery.

T	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
2	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
3	become effective on:
4	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
5	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
6	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
7	bill; or
8	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
9	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
