**SECTION I AUTHORITY**

The scheduling of controlled substances are proposed pursuant to Ark. Stat. Ann. §5-64-216.

**SECTION II PURPOSE**

The proposal to schedule Anabolic Steroids into Schedule III of the Arkansas Controlled Substances List is based on the Anabolic Steroids Control Act of 1990 (Pub. L. 101-647) requiring the placement of Anabolic Steroids into Schedule III of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 801, et seq.) and provides a definition for such steroids. This placement into Schedule III, therefore, classifies these Anabolic Steroids as controlled substances.

**SECTION III GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

Page 10 of 13 (March 1991 Revision) Controlled Substances List is amended by creating a new paragraph (f) to read as follows:

(f) Anabolic Steroids. Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in another schedule, any material, compound, mixture, or preparation containing an quantity of the following substances, including its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers whenever the existence of such salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical designation:

- (1) Boldenone;
- (2) Chlorotestosterone (4-chlortestosterone);
- (3) Clostebol;
- (4) Dehydrochlormethyltestosterone;
- (5) Dihydrotestosterone (4-dihydrotestosterone);
- (6) Drostanolone;
- (7) Ethylestrenol;
- (8) Fluoxymesterone;
- (9) Formebolone (formebolone);
- (10) Mesterolone;
- (11) Methandienone;
- (12) Methandranone;
- (13) Methandriol;

- (14) Methandrostenolone;
- (15) Methenolone;

---

- (16) Methyltestosterone;
- (17) Mibolerone;
- (18) Nandrolone;
- (19) Norethandrolone;
- (20) Oxandrolone;
- (21) Oxymesterone;
- (22) Oxymetholone;
- (23) Stanolone;
- (24) Stanozolol;
- (25) Testolactone;
- (26) Testosterone;
- (27) Trenbolone; and
- (28) Any salt, ester, or isomer of a drug or substance described or listed in this paragraph, if that salt, ester, or isomer promotes muscle growth.

#### SECTION IV REPEAL

All rules and regulations and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
