Ark. Admin. Code 007.33.8-2 (Formerly cited as AR ADC 029.00.2) PART 2. RULES A. APPLICATIONS FOR STATE BOARD EXAMINATIONS AND LICENSURE.

3. Application to the Board for Examination or Licensure.

(a) Applicants responsible for complete credentials. It shall be the responsibility of the applicant to furnish the necessary credentials as the Board deems necessary or as required by law. Submission of credentials does not mean automatic acceptance for examination.

1. The Board shall waive the initial license application fee if the applicant:

(a) Is receiving assistance through the Arkansas Medicaid Program; the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children; the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program; or the Lifeline Assistance Program;

(b) Was approved for unemployment within the last twelve (12) months; or

(C) Has an income that does not exceed two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty income guidelines.

(b) All credentials other than the National Board Part IV score must be in the hands of the Executive Director, with a postmark and or electronic receipt from the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners no later than forty-five (45) days before the intended examination date. The National Board Part IV score must be in the hands of the Executive Director with the postmark and or electronic receipt from the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners no later than soven (7) days before the examination date. Incomplete applications will not be considered and will be returned by the Executive Director with the notation "Application Incomplete."

(c) The Board's decision at the time of the credentials survey shall be final for that examination.

(d) Effective January 1, 2008, every person applying for a license issued by the Board shall provide written authorization to the Board to allow the Identification Bureau of the Arkansas State Police to release the results of a criminal history background check to the Board. Each applicant shall complete a state fingerprint card in the presence of a law enforcement officer, and shall have that officer sign the card, giving his/her jurisdiction, the date, and his/her badge number. The applicant shall be responsible for payment of all fees associated with the background check.

(e) Each applicant will be notified by the Board as to his/her acceptability for examination by notice mailed not more than fourteen (14) days after the Board has met to review and pass on said applicants.

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(f) Upon denial for cause, the applicant shall have the right to petition the Board for a hearing to prove his/her qualifications, with the burden of proof, at such hearing to rest with the applicant.

(g) If this Board deems it necessary, it may, at any time prior to licensure, require applicant to supply to the Board's satisfaction such further information or documents necessary to establish the applicant's qualifications.

(h) The Board shall grant a license to an applicant who fulfills the Arkansas requirements for licensure and is a person who holds a Federal I-766 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services-issued Employment Authorization Document, known popularly as a "work permit."

The Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners hereby issue the following proposed amendments to its Rules pursuant to its authority under Ark. Code Ann. §§ 17-81-101 et. seq.

Pursuant to Acts 135, 390, 589, 725, 746, and 748 of the 93rd General Assembly Regular Session (2021), the Rules of the Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners are being updated to amend rules concerning animal chiropractic, licensure for military veterans, advertising by chiropractic physicians, application for state board examination and licensure, and pre-licensure criminal background check waiver request.

Proposed Rule Regarding Applications for State Board Examination and Licensure

PURPOSE

The Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic is seeking to amend the Applications for State Board Examination and Licensure section of the Board's rules. Amendments are according to Acts 725 and 746 of 2021.

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to ACA §17-81-101, the Board has authority to promulgate rules necessary to carry out the functions of the Board. Several pieces of legislation were enacted in the 2021 General Session that affected the Board's administrative functions and/or licensure requirements that would require amendments to current rules. The ASBCE Board, Board Director, and legal counsel prepared the attached rule amendments as a result of this legislation. The Board approved these proposed amendments at their November 4, 2021 and December 9, 2021 board meetings.

KEY POINTS

The proposed amendments contain the following changes:

- Adding additional section to license application rule to include waiver section if individual is receiving financial assistance through state program(s).
- Adding additional section to license application rule providing that licensure may be issued to an induvial who holds a "work permit".

DISCUSSION

These rule changes use model language prepared by the Attorney General's office to comply with legislative changes that affect multiple boards.

RECOMMENDATION

We recommend that the proposed amendments to the Board's Rule be approved as proposed by the Board.
