II. Application Procedures:

- E. Waiver Request for Offenses on Background Check
- 1. If an individual has been convicted of an offense listed in A.C.A. §17-23-102(a) or (e), except those permanently disqualifying offenses found in A.C.A. §17-2-102(e), the Board may waive disqualification of a potential applicant or revocation of a license based on the conviction if a request for a waiver is made by:
- G. Licensure for Active Duty Uniformed Service Members, <u>Returning MilitaryUniformed</u> Service Veterans, and their Spouses
 - As used in this subsection, "returning military veteran <u>uniformed service</u> veteran" means a former member of the United States Armed Forces <u>Uniformed Services</u> who was discharged from active duty under circumstances other than dishonorable.
 - 2. The Board shall grant automatic licensure to an individual who holds a substantially equivalent license in another U.S. jurisdiction is the holder in good standing of a license with a similar scope of practice issued by another state, territory, or district of the U.S. and is:
 - a. An active duty military <u>A uniformed</u> service member stationed in the State of Arkansas;
 - b. A returning military veteran applying for licensure within one (1) year of his or her discharge from active duty <u>A uniformed service</u> veteran who resides in or establishes residency in the State of <u>Arkansas;</u> or
 - c. The spouse of: a person under Section G(2) a and b above.
 - (1) <u>A person under B (1) or (2) above;</u>
 - (2) <u>A uniformed service member who is assigned a tour of</u> duty that excludes the uniformed service member's spouse from accompanying the uniformed service member and the spouse relocates to this state; or
 - (3) <u>A uniformed service member who is killed or succumbs to</u> <u>his or her injuries or illness in the line of duty if the spouse</u> <u>establishes residency in the state.</u>
 - 3. The Board shall grant automatic licensure upon receipt of all of the following:
 - a. Payment of the initial application and licensure fee;
 - b. Evidence that the individual holds a substantially equivalent license with a similar scope of practice in another state; and
 - c. Evidence that the applicant is a qualified applicant under Section E(ii) above.
 - 4. The expiration date of a license for a deployed uniform service member or spouse will be extended for one hundred and eighty (180) days following the date of the uniformed service member's return from deployment.
 - 5. <u>A full exemption from continuing education requirements will be allowed</u> for a deployed uniform service member or spouse until one hundred and eighty (180) days following the date of the uniformed service member's

return from deployment.

J. <u>The Board shall grant a license to an applicant who fulfills the Arkansas requirements for licensure and is a person who holds a Federal Form I-766 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services-issued Employment Authorization Document, known popularly as a "work permit."</u>

VII. Fees: (Ark. Code Ann. §17-103-205)

- B. <u>The Board shall waive the initial licensing fee if the applicant:</u>
 - 1. <u>Is receiving assistance through the Arkansas Medicaid Program, the</u> <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, the Special Supplemental</u> <u>Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children, the Temporary</u> <u>Assistance for Needy Families Program, or the Lifeline Assistance</u> <u>Program;</u>
 - 2. Was approved for unemployment within the last twelve (12) months; or
 - 3. <u>Has an income that does not exceed two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty income guidelines.</u>
- IX. Continuing Education Guidelines: (Ark. Code Ann. §17-103-203)
 - A. Definition:
 - 2. A SWCE Credit Hour represents one clock hour (60 minutes) of a SWCE activity. A credit hour represents actual time of the SWCE activity. For example, a workshop that begins at 9:00 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. with one-hour lunch break would provide five (5) credit hours for the participant. An exception would be for volunteer services provided under the Arkansas Volunteer Health Care Act, in which a credit hour represents eight (8) hours of volunteer services.

XIV. Telemedicine (Ark. Code Ann. §17-103-309)

- A. Definitions:
 - 2. "Originating site" means a site at which a patient is located at the time healthcare services are provided to him or her by means of telemedicine, including the home of a patient. Ark. Code Ann. §17-80-402(2).
- F. Professional Relationship Exceptions:

Under Ark. Code Ann. §17-80-403(c), "Professional relationship" does not include a relationship between a social worker and a client established only by the following:

- 1. An internet questionnaire;
- 2. An email message;
- 3. Patient-generated medical history;
- 4. Audio-only communication, including without limitation interactive audio;
- 5. Text messaging;
- 6. A facsimile machine; or
- 7. Any combination thereof.

G. Requirements for Services Provided Via Telemedicine: The following requirements apply to all services provided by social workers using telemedicine:

10. <u>Social workers may use telemedicine to provide group therapy. Telemedicine may</u> not be used for group therapy provided to a child who is eighteen (18) years of age or younger.

 - 2. The Board shall grant automatic licensure to an individual who is the holder in good standing of a license with a similar scope of practice issued by another state, territory, or district of the U.S. and is:
 - a. A uniformed service member stationed in the State of Arkansas;
 - b. A uniformed service veteran who resides in or establishes residency in the State of Arkansas; or
 - c. The spouse of:
 - (1) A person under B (1) or (2) above;
 - (2) A uniformed service member who is assigned a tour of duty that excludes the uniformed service member's spouse from accompanying the uniformed service member and the spouse relocates to this state; or
 - (3) A uniformed service member who is killed or succumbs to his or her injuries or illness in the line of duty if the spouse establishes residency in the state.
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 - 5. A full exemption from continuing education requirements will be allowed for a deployed uniform service member or spouse until one hundred and eighty (180) days following the date of the uniformed service member's return from deployment.
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
