The ARKANSAS NATURAL HERITAGE COMMISSION, meeting the Haried State December 9, 1994, adopted the following rule revision, to be effective March 6, 1995.

RULE NUMBER NHR81-1 Revised 1994

FEES FOR DATA RESEARCH

Data user	for staff time	per-record charge
agencies of government, 501(c)(3)-qualified not-for-profit organizations, and students engaged in completing their assignments	no charge for the first two hours of any project; thereafter, \$30.00/hour or fraction of an hour	no charge for the first 20 records; thereafter, \$1.50/record
all other organizations, offices, and individuals	\$30.00/hour or fraction of an hour	\$1.50/record

Notwithstanding the schedule of fees detailed above, the Director of the Natural Heritage Commission is authorized to enter into fixed-price contracts to provide services that go beyond retrieval of data already on hand. In such cases the fee will be determined through negotiation. The Director of the Natural Heritage Commission is authorized also to negotiate agreements to supply data/information in exchange for data/information.

When requested, the Natural Heritage Commission's staff will provide an estimate of cost prior to initiating research services. Prepayment is not required; invoices normally are sent with the data for which the charge is made.

Prospective users of ANHC data services should address requests to the director of the Natural Heritage Commission (at the address on the letterhead [above]). Letters should state how the information will be used and when the information is needed and should include a copy of a map delineating project boundaries (USGS 7.5' topographic map if possible). Typically, a two-week turn-around period is required; but larger jobs take longer.
