## NOTICE OF RULE MAKING

## Arkansas Department of Human Services

DHS Policy 5007, Security Incident Reporting and Response Policy

Pursuant to U.S. Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981, Ark. Code Ann. Sec. 25-10-101 et seq., Act 218 of 1983, and Act 348 of 1985, the Chief Fiscal and Administrative Officer, Department of Human Services (DHS), is proposing DHS Policy 5007, Security and Incident Reporting and Response.

The Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS) is proposing a policy that provides DHS with uniform departmental procedures for health care providers and other HIPAA covered entities to promptly notify affected individuals after a breach of unsecured protected health information. This policy is to be in compliance with the Health Information Technology or Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act.

The rule will be effective January 8, 2010.
