## NOTICE OF RULE MAKING

The Director of the Division of Behavioral Health Services hereby issues the following proposed rule(s) pursuant to the Arkansas Code 20-64-901 et seq.

January 1, 2011, the revised Licensure Standards for Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Treatment Programs become effective. All persons, partnership, associations, or corporations establishing, conducting, managing or operating and holding themselves out to the public as an alcohol and other drug abuse treatment program must be licensed by the Division of Behavioral Health Services, Office of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention, unless expressly exempted from the requirements.
