NOTICE OF RULE MAKING

The Director of the Division of Aging, Adult and Behavioral Health Services of the Department of Human Services announces for a public comment period of thirty (30) calendar days a notice of rulemaking for the following proposed rules under one or more of the following chapters, subchapters, or sections of the Arkansas Code: §§ 20-76-201, 20-77-107, 25-10-129, and 25-10-126.

Effective July 1, 2021:

The Director of the Division of Aging, Adult and Behavioral Health Services (DAABHS) is establishing temporary rules and suspending current rules due to the continuing declaration of a National Public Health Emergency. The suspension of current rules implements one or more portions of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA), Public Law No. 116-127, including the enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP), the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Public Law No. 116-136.

Suspending these rules allow providers to render maximum assistance to the citizens of Arkansas and provide uninterrupted services. These suspensions shall automatically end December 31, 2021. DAABHS extends the Person Centered Service Plans (PCSP) by suspending ARChoices rules requiring an expiration date 365 days from the date of the DHS RN signature, suspending the Living Choices periodic assessment, and suspending the semi-annual and annual evaluation requirements for Program of Allinclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) patients. DAABHS is suspending the corresponding changes in coverage based on failing to receive a timely evaluation for these programs. The Living Choices Assisted Living Facility Reimbursement rate reduction scheduled to occur January 1, 2021 will be suspended. Acute Crisis Unit benefit limits are suspended and the allowable code for the suspension is listed.

Please note that public comments submitted in response to this notice are considered public documents. A public comment, including the commenter's name and any personal information contained within the public comment, will be made publicly available and may be seen by various people.
