SUMMARY OF PROPOSED CHANGE TO RULE 224-25-1(b)

This rule lists the type of business entities that may apply for a license. The legislatures across the country occasionally create a new business type. This change will allow the Board to accept any type of legally recognized business organization without having to change the regulations in the future.
