The Health Services Commission placed a six (6) month moratorium on the acceptance of Permit of Approval applications for Residential Care Facilities (RCF). During this time period the Commission will form a Committee to recommend standards and criteria. The only applications accepted for review after July 18th will be from applicants that have previously contacted the Office of Long Term Care or the Health Services Agency about a specific RCF proposal and can provide written documentation of that contact.
