STATEMENT OF EMERGENCY HSC Regulation No. 014 P.P.E.. Moratorium on new applications for Child Health Management Services (CHMS) subject to Permit of Approval review.

This emergency administrative regulation places a moratorium on the acceptance of applications for a new Permit of Approval category entitled Child Health Management Services (CHMS) while the Health Services

Commission develops appropriate criteria for the review of such services. The Commission finds that imminent peril to the public, health, safety, or welfare requires adoption of this rule to be effective immediately upon filing on September 26,1997 since Act1360 of 1997 makes these facilities/agencies subject to review. The Commission needs an adopted methodology upon which to review this type of service in place prior to the acceptance of applications. This regulation will be replaced with an ordinary administrative regulation.

Moratorium on the acceptance of Child Health Management Services (CHMS) application materials or the placing of CHMS applications under Permit of Approval (POA) review. For the time period commencing September 26, 1997 and ending January 24, 1998 (or 120 days) a Moratorium exists in order for the Health Services Commission to have time to develop and adopt criteria prior to the acceptance of CHMS applications for POA review.
