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- 11. Minimum prescription equipment specifications as authorized by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy are:
  - 1. Graduates capable of measuring from .1ml to at least 120ml.
  - 2. Mortars and pestles--at least one (porcelain or glass).
  - 3. Hot and cold running water in prescription department.
  - 4. Spatulas.
  - 5. Ointment slab or ointment papers.
  - 6. Exempt narcotic record book.
  - 7. Class III Balance and Weights.
  - 8. Equipment for Labeling.
  - 9. Pharmacy Library--Each pharmacy shall have:
    - (a). available for use by the pharmacist and use by the patient either current drug information manuals, or computer capability of printing current drug information for the pharmacist and patient drug information and monographs for patients. (i.e: The U.S.P. DI 3 Book Set including "Drug Information for the Healthcare Professional" {2 Volumes} and "Advice for the Patient" {1 Volume}); or "Drug Facts and Comparisons" and "Patient Drug Facts")
    - (b) other pharmacy reference books and periodicals necessary for effective pharmacy practice.

EXCEPTIONS: Pharmacies meeting the requirements of Regulation 38 or Regulation 43 shall be exempted from requirements of this Regulation when not applicable. (10/09/80) (Revised 6/25/83, 4/07/89 and 6/07/90)

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- 11. Minimum prescription equipment specifications as authorized by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy are:
  - 1. Graduates capable of measuring from .lml one-minim to at least 500 ee120ml.
  - 2. Mortars and pestles--at least three one (porcelain or glass).
  - 3. Hot and cold running water in prescription department.
  - 4. Spatulas—Steel, at least three assorted sizes; Nonmetallic, at least two assorted sizes.
  - 5. Funnels—at least three assorted sizes.
  - 6. Stirring Rods Glass or rubber.
  - 57. Ointment slab or ointment papers.
  - 8. Prescription files.
  - 69. Poison record book and Exempt narcotic record book.
  - 710. Scales and Balances for bulk, medium, and light-weighing, at least one of which must be a Class A III Balance and Weights.
  - 11. Weights Apothecary and Avoirdupois from ½ gr. to 1 lb. metric from 0.02 GM. to 60 GM.
  - 812. TypewriterEquipment for Labeling
  - 13. Numbering machines.
  - 14. Label Moistener and/or proper-prescription-labels.
  - 159. Pharmacy Library--Eeach pharmacy shall have:
    - (a). available for personal-use by the pharmacist a current copy of and use by the patient-use either current drug information manuals, or computer capbility of printing current drug information for the pharmacist and patient drug information and monographs for patients. (i.e. The U.S.P. DI 3 Book Set including "Drug Information for the Healthcare Professional" {2 Volumes} and "Advice for the Patient" {1 Volume}); or "Drug Facts and Comparisons" and "Patient Drug Facts")
    - (b) in addition toother pharmacy reference books and periodicals necessary for effective pharmacy practice.
  - 16. miscellaneous equipment—reasonable amount of consumable material like filter papers; litmus paper; empty capsules; ointment jars; collapsible tubes; bottles; capsule, pill and powder boxes, and labels.
