SUBJECT: Extended Supervision of Sex Offenders

- **I. AUTHORITY.** The Board of Corrections is vested with the authority to promulgate this administrative regulation by Arkansas law sections 12-27-105, 16-93-1203 and 16-93-1205.
- **II. POLICY.** Arkansas Community Correction will supervise sex offenders placed on extended supervision pursuant to Arkansas law and established policy.
- **III. APPLICABILITY.** This policy applies to ACC employees.

IV. GUIDANCE.

A. Within 120 days before the release from probation of a person who is required to register as a sex offender, Arkansas Community Correction (ACC) must notify in writing the prosecuting attorney in the judicial district in which the person was sentenced of the person's impending release from probation.

Similarly, the Arkansas Department of Correction notifies the prosecuting attorney before release on parole of a person who is required to register as a sex offender and the State Hospital has a similar requirement for sex offender patients.

The prosecuting attorney may file a petition in the circuit court requesting that the sex offender pending release from incarceration, probation, or inpatient treatment, be subject to an extended period of supervision and monitoring.

- **B.** Arkansas Community Correction must develop and maintain policy for supervising sex offenders placed on extended supervision by the court. ACC must supervise such offenders pursuant to law, court orders and policy. ACC may establish reasonable requirements that are in line with common supervision practices including participation in programs and may levy sanctions. Violation reports may be sent to the prosecuting attorney and court. Customary supervision and program fees will be charged.
- **C.** While in extended supervision status, the sex offender is expected to comply with the court imposed extended supervision order, court ordered conditions, and ACC conditions.
