Statement of Need For Amended Rule 5.0 (Addendum A-10) 05/01/01

The Assessment Coordination Department finds that imminent peril to the public health, safety, or welfare requires adoption of a rule upon fewer than twenty (20) days notice.

The reason for the finding is as follows: Act 1185 of 1999 requires counties to submit reappraisal plans before July 1 to the Assessment Coordination Department. This rule is a change in the bid specifications a county must submit before contracting. In order to write, let and receive bids to submit to our agency these changed specifications need to be sent out immediately.
