**Resolution Adopting Rule F.4., Qualifications for Direct Clinical Supervision
and Declaring an Emergency**

I, Bill Visor move that the Board adopt the attached Rule F.4., Qualifications for Direct Clinical Supervision of the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors and make the following finding of an emergency:

Whereas there is no Direct Clinical Supervision Qualification in effect governing licensees of this Board and

Whereas, the profession of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors needs specified qualifications for direct clinical supervisors of licensees of this Board,

Therefore, the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors finds that there is an imminent peril to the public health, safety, and welfare that requires adoption of Rule F.4., Qualification for Direct Clinical Supervision, an emergency rule that should take effect immediately.

**PROPOSED RULE F.4. QUALIFICATION FOR DIRECT CLINICAL
SUPERVISION**

F.4. Qualification for Direct Clinical Supervision

a. Counselors who provide direct clinical supervision for persons credentialed by the ASBEADAC must be a LADAC and/or licensed master level clinician with three years experience in the treatment field of substance related disorders.

b. Clinical Supervision is defined as any person responsible for planning, directing, monitoring, and evaluating the work of counselors credentialed as a Licensed Associate Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselor or Certified Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Technician by the ASBEADAC.

c. Any person providing direct supervision must complete a minimum of twenty-four hours training every two years in the performance domain for clinical supervision to include:

- Assessment and Evaluation
- Counselor Development
- Professional Responsibility
- Management and Administration

d. Six hours training specific to clinical supervision within the four domains, in addition to six hours "Ethics" training, is required every two years, upon completion of twenty-four hour requirement.
