GARBAGE FEEDING REGULATION RULE (SWINE)

Regulation No. 14

Section 1

For the purpose of this regulation rule:

- (a) "Garbage", regardless of previous processing, means any animal or vegetable wastes resulting from handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of foods, including parts of animal carcasses, or contents of offal.
- (b) "Person" shall means state, any municipality, political subdivision, institution, public or private corporation, individual, partnership or any other entity.
- (c) A "gGarbage dump" is means a place where ordinary household garbage is disposed of from two or more families.

Section 2. Each garbage feeding establishment shall be required to obtain and display a feeding permit, which may be obtained free of charge from the supervising inspector or his representative. This permit shall remain in force during such time as satisfactory practices are maintained.

Section 3. Any person who shall sell, give away or otherwise dispose of garbage to any person shall be required to furnish the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission the name and address of the party or parties who obtain garbage. This shall not apply to those persons whose garbage is collected by municipalities or persons who have a permit to collect garbage or persons who may sell, give away or otherwise dispose of his or her own ordinary household garbage.

Section 4. Upon determination that any person having a permit issued under this regulation, or who has applied for a permit hereunder, has violated or failed to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation, the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission may revoke such permit or refuse to issue a permit to any applicant.

Section 5. All garbage, regardless of previous processing before it reaches the garbage feeding establishments or farm, shall be thoroughly heated to at least 212 degrees F. (boiling temperature) for at least 30 minutes before being fed to the swine. The premises on which garbage feeding is permitted under this regulation must be kept free of collection of unused garbage and waste material in order that proper sanitation, rat and fly control measures can be practiced as a further means of prevention and spread of disease in either animal or human health.

Section 6.

1. GARBAGE FEEDING PROHIBITIONS

Feeding garbage to swine and allowing swine to have access to a garbage dump is prohibited.

It is prohibited to

- A. Feed swine any of the following:
- 1. Animal carcasses or parts thereof;
- 2. Meat products or meat by-products;
- 3. Offal or contents thereof;

whether raw or resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, or consumption of foods.

B. Allow swine access to a site where ordinary household garbage is disposed of from two or more families.

II. ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY

<u>A.</u> Any authorized representative of the Arkansas <u>Livestock and Poultry Commission</u>
<u>Department of Agriculture (Department)</u> shall have the power to enter at reasonable times upon any private property for the purpose of determining that proper cooking temperatures, as specified in Section 5, have been reached for the proper period of time and for inspecting and investigating any conditions relating to heating of garbage to be fed to swine as required by this regulation compliance with this rule.

Any authorized representative of the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission may examine any records or memoranda pertaining to the feeding of garbage to swine. The Commission may require maintenance of records relating to the operation of equipment for and procedure of treating garbage to be fed to swine. Copies of such records shall be submitted to the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission on request.

Section 7

(a) <u>B.</u> The <u>Livestock and Poultry Commission</u> <u>State Veterinarian</u> is authorized to quarantine for a period of <u>thirty forty-five</u> (45) days any pigs that have been fed <u>improperly cooked garbage or raw garbage.</u> <u>in violation of this rule.</u> <u>Hogs Swine</u> may not be sold <u>or removed</u> from <u>these the</u> premises until the quarantine has been officially removed by a representative of the <u>Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission</u> (<u>Department</u>).

(b) No person, firm, or corporation shall permit hogs on any garbage dump.

Section 8 C. This regulation <u>rule</u> shall not apply to any person who feeds only his own household garbage to the swine

<u>It is not a violation of this rule to feed swine as otherwise prohibited by Section I of this rule that</u> are

- 1. considered pets; or
- 2. for consumption only by the immediate family of the owner of the swine.

Swine described in this Section (II.C.) and under no circumstances shall the swine be sold to a market or through private treaty until the swine have been must be fed on grain or traditional swine feed for forty-five (45) days prior to being sold or removed from the premises.

III. PENALTIES AND AUTHORITY

A. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this rule may result in administrative penalties as provided by law.

- 1. First offense will result in a Warning letter.
- 2. Second or subsequent offense will result in a Notice to Appear before the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission for a determination of proper administrative penalties.

B. Authority. A.C.A. §§ 2-32-501 et seq.; 2-33-107(a); 2-40-103.

GARBAGE FEEDING RULE (SWINE)

I. GARBAGE FEEDING PROHIBITIONS

It is prohibited to

- A. Feed swine any of the following:
- 1. animal carcasses or parts thereof;
- 2. meat products or meat by-products;
- 3. offal or contents thereof;

whether raw or resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, or consumption of foods.

B. Allow swine access to a site where ordinary household garbage is disposed of from two or more families.

II. ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY

A. Any authorized representative of the Arkansas Department of Agriculture (Department) shall have the power to enter at reasonable times upon any private property for the purpose of determining compliance with this rule.

- B. The State Veterinarian is authorized to quarantine for a period of forty-five (45) days any swine that have been fed in violation of this rule. Swine may not be sold or removed from the premises until the quarantine has been officially removed by a representative of the Department.
- C. It is not a violation of this rule to feed swine as otherwise prohibited by Section I of this rule that are:
- 1. considered pets; or
- 2. for consumption only by the immediate family of the owner of the swine.

Swine described in this Section (II.C) must be fed on grain or traditional swine feed for forty-five (45) days prior to being sold or removed from the premises.

III. PENALTIES AND AUTHORITY

- A. Failure to comply with any of the provision of this rule may result in administrative penalties as provided by law.
- 1. First offense will result in a warning letter.
- 2. Second or subsequent offense will result in a Notice to Appear before the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission for a determination for proper administrative penalties.
- B. Authority. A.C.A §§ 2-32-501 et seq.; 2-33-107(a); 2-40-103.

Summary of Proposed Amendments to the Garbage Feeding (Swine) Rule

October 2, 2020

Purpose:

The Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission (Commission) is proposing amendments to its rule regarding feeding garbage to swine.

Background:

The Commission's current rule authorizes the Commission to issue a permit for the feeding of garbage to swine. On December 12, 2019, the Commission proposed amendments to the rule to ban the feeding of garbage, including any animal or vegetable wastes resulting from handling, preparation, cooking, and consumption of foods, and parts of animal carcasses, to swine.

At the ALC Administrative Rules Review subcommittee meeting June 17, 2020, committee members had concerns about the proposed changes, specifically the prohibition against feeding vegetable wastes and the broad discretion the Commission has in penalty assessment. The Department agreed to pull the rule back and address the subcommittee's concerns. At its July 22, 2020 meeting, the Commission approved a new version to address those issues.

Key Points:

- prohibits feeding of meat and meat by-products to swine and allowing swine to have access to garbage and garbage dumps
- allows feeding of vegetable wastes to swine
- authorizes State Veterinarian to quarantine swine that have been fed meat or meat by-products
- provides for a warning letter for first offenses

Discussion:

Feeding garbage to swine is a direct path for introducing diseases to swine. The spread of African Swine Fever (ASFV) has been directly linked to garbage feeding. ASFV is a serious, highly contagious, viral disease of pigs that can spread very rapidly in swine populations by direct or indirect contact. It can persist for long periods in uncooked swine products, facilitating its introduction into new areas. This virus can also become endemic in feral hogs, and transmission cycles between these animals and ticks can complicate or even prevent eradication. ASFV isolates vary in virulence from highly pathogenic strains that cause near 100% mortality to low–virulence isolates that can be difficult to diagnose. There is no vaccine or treatment.

Industry has prohibited garbage feeding in commercial operations. Twenty-two (22) states have banned the practice of private owners feeding garbage to swine. No garbage feeding permits have been issued by the Commission to swine operations in several years.
