Markup REGULATIONS RULES UNDER ACT 410-THE ARKANSAS PESTICIDE CONTROL ACT

REGULATION RULE NO. 1. Registration Fees; Expiration of Registration -

- (1) Through December 31, 2007 the The registration fee for each pesticide product registered for calendar year 2007 by any manufacturer, registrant or distributor shall be \$150. For products registered for calendar year 2008, the registration fee shall be \$200. For products registered for calendar year 2009 and each additional year thereafter the fee shall be \$250. Registrations shall expire December 31 of the year for which registered. This fee does not include the Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide Disposal Fee as required by Act 1130 of 2001 established pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 8-7-1206(a)(1).
- (2) All registrants shall pay an Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide Disposal Fee of \$70 per year for each registered pesticide beginning July 1, 2022, and for each additional year thereafter.

RULE NO. 1. Registration Fees; Expiration of Registration -

- (1) The registration fee for each pesticide product registered shall be \$250. Registrations shall expire December 31 of the year for which registered. This fee does not include the Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide Disposal Fee as established pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 8-7-1206(a)(1).
- (2) All registrants shall pay an Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide Disposal Fee of \$70 per year for each registered pesticide beginning July 1, 2022, and for each additional year thereafter.

SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED ARKANSAS STATE PLANT BOARD RULES AMENDING THE ANNUAL PESTICIDE DISPOSAL FEE FOR ALL REGISTERED PESITICIDE PRODUCTS

Purpose

This memorandum analyzes the proposed amendments to the Arkansas State Plant Board (Plant Board) Rules Under the Arkansas Pesticide Control Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 8-7-1201 et seq, setting the amount of the annual pesticide disposal fee in rule.

Background

The Arkansas Pesticide Control Act requires pesticide manufacturers to register all pesticide products annually with the Arkansas Department of Agriculture (Department). That Act required pesticide manufacturers to pay an annual \$50 pesticide disposal fee for each registered pesticide. The Act was amended by Act 364 of 2021 which provided that the Plant Board would, by rule, establish the amount of the annual disposal fee, not to exceed \$100 per product. The proposed rule amendment sets the annual disposal fee at \$70 per product beginning July 1, 2022. Therefore, this is not a new fee, but the amount of the fee is now established in rule instead of in statute.

The rule amendment was drafted based upon the recommendation of the Abandoned Pesticide Advisory Board, which is comprised of members from the Arkansas Department of Agriculture, the Arkansas Department of Energy and Environment, Arkansas Farm Bureau, the University of Arkansas Cooperative Extension Service, and the United States Natural Resources Conservation Service. The Abandoned Pesticide Advisory Board also solicited input from pesticide manufacturers, all of whom were supportive of the fee change.

Key Points

- Current law requires all pesticide manufacturers to register their products annually with the
 Department and pay a pesticide disposal fee for each product registered. The fees are used to
 collect, transport, and dispose of unwanted pesticides in Arkansas.
- Act 364 of 2021 provided that the Plant Board shall establish by rule the amount of the annual pesticide disposal fee not to exceed \$100 per product.
- The proposed rule amendment sets the annual pesticide disposal fee at \$70.
- A fee increase is needed to keep pace with the rising costs of pesticide disposal.

Discussion

Revenues from the fee are used for the collection, transportation, and disposal of unwanted pesticides through a third-party contractor. Average Department annual revenue from the fee is approximately \$400,000 per year. The Department has disposed of over 5.2 million pounds of unwanted pesticides since 2005.

The Department has historically performed an average of fifteen abandoned pesticide collection events per year. However, due to increased third-party disposal costs, the Department has reduced the number of collections to ten per year. Increasing the annual pesticide disposal fee to \$70 per product will enable to the Department to return to fifteen collection events per-year.
